RAPID TRANSIT

BACKGROUND

At the March 28, April 11, and August 22, 2023 City Council meetings, the City Council heard presentations on the status of the Eco-Rapid Transit (ERT) joint powers authority. During the presentations, staff discussed the serious fiscal challenges facing ERT as a result of past budgetary practices, resulting in insufficient funds to support basic operations and to provide services for member cities. At the April 11th meeting ERT requested advanced payment of membership dues to help the organization pay its bills and staff informed the City Council that ERT would likely return to its members requesting additional financial assistance after the start of the 2023-24 fiscal year.

At the August 22nd meeting, the City Council was informed that City staff received an email from the Executive Director of ERT requesting payment from the City in the amount of \$13,888, which, according to the invoice, would be the final payment by the City of Paramount to ERT. This amount reflected the direction the ERT Board gave to the ERT staff at its July 12, 2023 meeting, to begin the restructuring of this joint powers authority to facilitate the conclusion of normal operations of Eco-Rapid Transit as a full-functioning JPA. In response to this information, the City Council authorized the City Manager to remit the City's final membership payment to ERT with the understanding that under this scenario, ERT would dissolve and cease to exist.

DISCUSSION

At the ERT Board of Directors meeting on September 13, 2023, the Board voted unanimously in support of the formal termination of the joint powers authority and directed staff to proceed with necessary steps for dissolution (see attached Board report dated September 13, 2023). As part of the dissolution process, each member city is required to adopt a resolution formally authorizing the termination of ERT. The attached resolution, drafted by ERT General Counsel's Office, must be formally adopted prior to the last ERT Board meeting scheduled for November 8, 2023.

FISCAL IMPACT

There is no fiscal impact.

VISION, MISSION, VALUES, AND STRATEGIC OUTCOMES

The City's Vision, Mission, and Values set the standard for the organization; establish priorities, uniformity, and guidelines; and provide the framework for policy decision making. The Strategic Outcomes were implemented to provide a pathway to achieving the City's Vision. This item aligns with Strategic Outcome No. 6: Efficient, Effective, and Fiscally Responsible.

RECOMMENDED ACTION

It is recommended that the City Council read by title only and adopt Resolution No. 23:032 authorizing the termination of Eco-Rapid Transit.

RECOMMENDATION

Authorize Executive Director and General Counsel's Office to take steps to terminate Eco-Rapid Transit subject to final Board approval.

ISSUES

Staff are seeking the Board's authorization to take steps, including all debts are paid off and past audits are completed, to terminate Eco-Rapid, subject to final Board approval.

BACKGROUND

At its July 2023 meeting, the Board approved a limited operating budget for FY2023-24 through December 31, 2023 and directed staff to explore restructuring options with Gateway Cities Council of Governments (GCCOG).

On August 9, 2023, ERT Executive Director, Eric Shen, held a formal meeting with Mr. Hector De La Torre, GCCOG Executive Director and Ms. Marisa Perez GCCOG Executive Deputy. The meeting was also guided by Ms. Ivy Tsai, GCCOG General Counsel and Mr. Matthew Summers, ERT General Counsel. At the conclusion of the meeting, Mr. De La Torre agreed to present a proposal to GCCOG's Governing Board for creating a new committee that will continue advocating for the WSAB Project at policy level. In concept, the new committee would be open to jurisdictions within GCCOG and situated along the new transit corridor, most of them are current ERT members. Ms. Perez will provide additional details of the new committee at the ERT Board meeting on September 13 and with the WSAB City Managers Technical Advisory Committee on September 14, 2023.

The new GCCOG committee could be in operation by early 2024. Other than the City of Glendale and the Burbank Airport Authority, the current Eco-Rapid Transit members within GCCOG region will be eligible to join the new committee.

While the current Eco-Rapid Transit Board may consider keeping the current joint powers authority in an inactive state after December 31, 2023, the Board would need to consider the regulatory compliance and associated costs. In the proposed GCCOG Corridor Cities Committee concept, Mr. Da La Torre has clearly stated that GCCOG does not have the resources to administer the inactive Eco-Rapid Transit.

In the interest of accountability, the Board is advised to contemplate the formal termination of the joint powers authority rather than maintaining it in an inactive state. Should the Board consider and approve staff's recommendation, staff will begin taking steps to terminate Eco-Rapid Transit as a joint powers authority, subject to final Board approval.

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PARAMOUNT AUTHORIZING THE TERMINATION OF ECO-RAPID TRANSIT

WHEREAS, Eco-Rapid Transit ("ERT"), formally known as Orangeline Development Authority, is a Joint Powers Authority formed in 2003 to pursue development of a transit system along the Gateway Cities Corridor that moves as rapidly as possible, uses grade separation as appropriate, and is environmentally friendly and energy efficient; and

WHEREAS, the City of Paramount has been a member of ERT since October 5, 2004; and

WHEREAS, the City of Paramount has chosen Mayor Isabel Aguayo, to serve on the ERT Board of Directors as its representative; and

WHEREAS, in part due to ERT's advocacy, Los Angeles County Metropolitan Transportation Authority ("LA Metro") has resolved to develop the West Santa Ana Branch Transit Corridor ("WSAB") project – a light rail transit line that will connect southeast LA County to downtown Los Angeles; and

WHEREAS, ERT has therefore served its purpose; and

WHEREAS, during ERT's July 12, 2023 Regular Meeting, the ERT Board of Directors approved an annual budget through Resolution No. 2023-05, with the intention of restructuring the agency by December 31, 2023; and

WHEREAS, during ERT's September 13, 2023 Regular Meeting, the ERT Board of Directors authorized ERT Executive Director and ERT General Counsel's Office to take steps to terminate ERT subject to final Board approval; and

WHEREAS, under Section 3.2(i) of the ERT Joint Powers Agreement, ERT may terminate upon the unanimous vote of its Members; and

WHEREAS, under Section 3.2(a)(7) of the ERT Joint Powers Agreement, any debts of ERT are its own debts, not debts of its members, including the City of Paramount.

WHEREAS, the ERT Board of Directors desires to terminate ERT.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PARAMOUNT AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The above recitations are true and correct.

SECTION 2. The City Council authorizes its ERT representative to vote to terminate ERT under Section 3.2(i) of the ERT Joint Powers Agreement.

SECTION 3. The City Council directs the City Manager and staff to take all needed actions to complete the City of Paramount's withdrawal from ERT, including paying any amounts owed to ERT as final membership dues.

SECTION 4. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.

ACCEPTANCE OF WORK **FOR NEIGHBORHOOD** Subject: STREET

RESURFACING (CITY PROJECT NO. 9331)

BACKGROUND

Each year, the City allocates funding for neighborhood street resurfacing. This includes grinding down the asphalt and repaving streets, replacing damaged curb and gutter, repairing sidewalks, slurry seal pavement, and installing Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) curb ramps to ensure proper access for all pedestrians. Repairs are planned based on the recommendations of the Pavement Management System, a report completed by our City Engineering firm, Willdan Engineering. The report is a comprehensive review of the condition of all city streets within Paramount boundaries and identifies those streets in most need of repair.

On March 14, 2023, the Director of Public Works opened bids for the project, and the project was awarded to Onyx Paving Co., at the City Council meeting on March 28, 2023. A Notice to Proceed was issued with a start date of May 8, 2023.

DISCUSSION

The work performed under this contract has been inspected under the supervision of the Public Works Director, in conformance with Section 6-8 of the Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction.

The project was completed on September 1, 2023, and the Notice of Completion will be filed with the Los Angeles County Recorder's office after approval by the City Council. The contract retention of \$81,251.07 will be held for thirty-five (35) days from that date.

The final construction cost is \$1,625,021.31 and is below the total budgeted amount of \$1,900,000.00.

Funding for this project was included in the Fiscal Year 2022-23 and 2023-24 Capital Improvements Project Budget utilizing Measure R funds. The total project amount of \$1,625,021.31 is below the already appropriated amount of \$1,900,000. Therefore, there is currently no additional fiscal impact to the City.

MARCH 5, 2024 GENERAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION

BACKGROUND

The City of Paramount's next General Municipal Election is scheduled for Tuesday, March 5, 2024, to elect three (3) Members of the City Council. The nomination period for City Council candidates is Monday, November 13, 2023 through Friday, December 8, 2023. However, if an incumbent Councilmember whose term of office expires in March 2024 does not file for office, the nomination period will be extended to Wednesday, December 13, 2023 for candidates other than the incumbent.

To initiate the election process for the City's March 5, 2024 General Municipal Election, the City Council must adopt three resolutions – one calling the election; one adopting regulations related to candidate statements, and one requesting consolidation and services from the County of Los Angeles. Each resolution is explained in detail below.

DISCUSSION

Calling the Election

Resolution No. 23:033 calls for an election to be held in the City of Paramount on Tuesday, March 5, 2024, establishes the purpose of the election (to elect three (3) Members of the City Council), and authorizes the City Clerk to coordinate with the Los Angeles County Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk ("County Registrar") to conduct the election.

Candidate Statements

Each candidate for City Council may prepare a Candidate Statement to be included in the Official Sample Ballot Booklet and/or published on the Los Angeles County Registrar/Recorder-County Clerk's website. Pursuant to Elections Code Section 13307, certain regulations pertaining to materials prepared by candidates for municipal elections must be adopted by the governing body.

Resolution No. 23:034 formalizes and adopts regulations regarding the Candidate Statement. The resolution includes the following:

- Specifies the type of material which may be included in the Candidate Statement.
- Places a 200 word limitation on Candidate Statements.
- Requires that the Candidate Statement be filed with the City Clerk at the time the candidate files a nomination paper.
- Stipulates that a Candidate Statement may be withdrawn, but not changed, during the period for filing a nomination paper and until 5:00 p.m. of the next working day after the close of the nomination period.
- Stipulates that pursuant to the Federal Voting Rights Act of 1965, as amended, a Candidate Statement shall be translated and printed into Spanish.
- Establishes that a deposit shall be required to cover the candidate's pro rata share of the estimated cost of printing, handling, translating, and mailing the Candidate Statement.
- Provides for the online posting of the Candidate Statement on the Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk website.
- Additionally, new this year, the resolution provides an option for candidates to have the Candidate Statement published on the Registrar/Recorder-County Clerk's website, at a set fee, in lieu of printing the statement in the Official Sample Ballot Booklet.

In accordance with regulations contained in this resolution, a copy of Resolution No. 23:034 will be provided to each candidate or the candidate's representative.

Requesting Consolidation and Services

Resolution No. 23:035 requests the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors to direct the Los Angeles County Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk to administer, manage, oversee, and perform all necessary functions, services and tasks related to the City of Paramount's General Municipal Election, and requests that the City's General Municipal Election be consolidated with the Presidential Primary Election to be held on March 5, 2024.

FISCAL IMPACT

The estimated cost associated with the election is \$140,000 and is included in the Fiscal Year 2023-24 adopted budget.

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PARAMOUNT ADOPTING REGULATIONS FOR CANDIDATES FOR ELECTIVE OFFICE PERTAINING TO CANDIDATE STATEMENTS SUBMITTED TO THE VOTERS AT AN ELECTION TO BE HELD ON TUESDAY, MARCH 5, 2024

WHEREAS, Section 13307 of the Elections Code of the State of California provides that the governing body of any local agency adopt regulations pertaining to materials prepared by any candidate for a municipal election, including costs of the Candidate Statement.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PARAMOUNT AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The above recitation is true and correct.

SECTION 2. GENERAL PROVISIONS. Pursuant to Section 13307 of the Elections Code of the State of California, each candidate for elective office to be voted for at an election to be held in the City of Paramount on March 5, 2024 may prepare a Candidate Statement on an appropriate form provided by the City Clerk. The statement may include the name, age and occupation of the candidate and a brief description of no more than 200 words of the candidate's education and qualifications expressed by the candidate himself or herself. The statement shall not include party affiliation of the candidate, nor membership or activity in partisan political organizations. The statement shall be filed in typewritten and digital form in the office of the City Clerk at the time the candidate's nomination papers are filed. The Candidate Statement may be withdrawn, but not changed, during the period for filing nomination papers and until 5:00 p.m. of the next working day after the close of the nomination period.

<u>SECTION 3</u>. FOREIGN LANGUAGE POLICY. Pursuant to the Federal Voting Rights Act, the Candidate Statement shall be translated into Spanish and all other required languages. In coordination with the Los Angeles County Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk ("County Registrar"), the City Clerk shall have all Candidate Statements translated and printed in the Official Sample Ballot Booklet in Spanish and all other required languages. The County Registrar will make the voter information guides and candidate statements in the required languages available at all vote centers, on the County's website, and in the Election Official's office.

SECTION 4. PAYMENT. For Candidate Statements to be printed in the Official Sample Ballot Booklet, the City Clerk shall work with the County Registrar to estimate the total cost of printing, handling, translating, and mailing the Candidate Statements filed, including costs incurred as a result of complying with the Voting Rights Act of 1965, as amended, and require each candidate filing a Candidate Statement to pay in advance to the City of Paramount his or her estimated pro rata share as a condition of having his or her statement included in the Official Sample Ballot Booklet. The estimate is just an

approximation of the actual cost that varies from one election to another election and may be significantly more or less than the estimate, depending on the actual number of candidates filing statements. Accordingly, the City Clerk is not bound by the estimate and may, on a pro rata basis, bill the candidate for additional actual expense or refund any excess paid depending on the final actual cost. In the event of underpayment, the City Clerk may require the candidate to pay the balance of the cost incurred. In the event of overpayment, the City Clerk shall prorate the excess amount among the candidates and refund the excess amount paid.

- SECTION 5. ELECTRONIC DISTRIBUTION. Pursuant to Section 13307(c) of the California Elections Code, the governing body of the City of Paramount authorizes the preparation of candidate statements for nonpartisan elective office for the purpose of electronic distribution. Candidates may prepare statements for electronic distribution pursuant to Section 13307(a) of the Elections Code. A statement prepared pursuant to this subdivision shall be posted on the internet website of the County Elections Official. Pursuant to Section 13307.7(a) of the Elections Code, candidates shall provide advance payment of the requisite fee to cover the duties and procedures set forth in Sections 13307(b) and (d) of the Elections Code. When a candidate submits a Candidate Statement to be printed in the Official Sample Ballot Booklet pursuant to Section 4 of this resolution, electronic distribution shall be included and no additional cost.
- <u>SECTION 6.</u> MISCELLANEOUS. Translations shall be provided by professionally-certified translators and the City Clerk and County Registrar shall comply with all recommendations and standards set forth by the California Secretary of State regarding occupational designations and other matters relating to elections.
- <u>SECTION 7</u>. ADDITIONAL MATERIALS. No candidate will be permitted to include additional materials in the Official Sample Ballot Booklet.
- **SECTION 8.** The City Clerk shall provide each candidate or the candidate's representative a copy of this resolution at the time nominating petitions are issued.
- **SECTION 9**. All previous resolutions establishing City Council policy on payment for Candidate Statements are repealed.
- **SECTION 10.** This resolution shall apply only to the election to be held on March 5, 2024 and shall then be repealed.
- **SECTION 11.** The City Clerk shall certify to the passage and adoption of this resolution and enter it in the book of original resolutions.
 - **SECTION 12.** This Resolution shall take effective immediately upon its adoption.

CONSTRUCTION SERVICES AT 15145 CASTANA AVENUE

BACKGROUND

The Paramount Home Improvement Program is funded with Federal Home Investment Partnership (HOME) monies and is intended to provide improvements for owner-occupied, single-family detached dwellings and mobile homes on fixed foundations. Grant funds only cover City-approved improvements, and applicants must meet strict guideline criteria as an income-qualifying senior (at least 62 years of age with household income at or below 80% of area median income) or as a low-to-moderate-income household (50% of the area median income for a particular household size). The City uses HOME funds to provide necessary improvements and correct deficient construction. The general contractor works closely with staff to ensure compliance with the Building Code and other construction codes.

DESCRIPTION

This request is for an award of contract for Home Improvement Program construction services at 15145 Castana Avenue. The contract is not between the City and a contractor; rather, the City facilitates a contract between the property owner and a contractor.

Below are photos of the property:





The homeowner solicited three construction bids from a City-approved bid package. VV&G was selected as the lowest qualified bidder. VV&G is a longstanding contractor in Paramount, and has maintained an active "B" General Building Contractor license since 2012. The work to be completed at the residence includes the following (summary attached) – reroof the house, replace windows, apply new stucco color coat, paint exterior trim, provide and install a new water heater, and provide and install smoke and carbon monoxide detectors.

Funding

Under the Home Improvement Program, the City contributes 80% or 90% of project construction costs with the property owner contributing 20% or 10% of the overall cost of construction depending on qualifying household status. A household is eligible to receive a maximum grant of \$21,600 if contributing 80% of project costs or a maximum grant of \$24,300 if contributing 90% of project costs. A project with total construction costs exceeding the combined formula requires the property owner to contribute additional funds.

In this case, the property owner qualifies for the 90% grant. The property owner will receive a \$8,000 loan and benefit from \$24,300 of HOME grant funds.

FISCAL IMPACT

Funding for the Home Improvement Program is included in the Fiscal Year 2023-2024 budget. The approved budget satisfies the required \$24,300.00 HOME funding for this project.

RECOMMENDED ACTION

It is recommended that the City Council award the contract for construction services to VV&G in the total amount of \$39,035.00 from Federal HOME funds and property owner contributions for Home Improvement Program construction services at 15145 Castana Avenue.

Subject: AWARD OF CONTRACT FOR WEST SANTA ANA BIKEWAY PHASE II

(CITY PROJECT NO. 9932)

BACKGROUND

For a number of years, the City has been pursuing funding and land lease agreements to construct the West Santa Ana Branch (WSAB) Bikeway Class I bicycle and pedestrian trail along the railroad right-of-way that runs diagonally across the City. The project has been planned in phases, allowing the City to request funding from different sources and negotiate the various lease agreements in order to complete the approximate 2.3 mile trail that connects users from the Los Angeles River to the San Gabriel River through the cities of Paramount and Bellflower. Phase II of this project, from Somerset Boulevard to Rosecrans Avenue, includes bicycle and pedestrian infrastructure improvements including fencing, energy efficient LED pedestrian lighting, landscaping, decomposed granite, Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) curb ramps, at-grade pedestrian/cyclist crossing, and street furniture for trail users. The project will improve mobility and connectivity through the City by expanding recreational opportunities for community members. This project aligns with the Bellflower-Paramount Joint Active Transportation Plan approved by City Council in 2019.

Funding for Phase II has been achieved through a variety of sources, including a competitive grant, Caltrans Active Transportation Program, and through funding allocations from the State budget from Speaker Emeritus Anthony Rendon in 2022, and from Senator Lena Gonzalez in 2023. At the time of Fiscal Year 2023-24 Budget preparation, the budget allocation from Senator Lena Gonzalez had not yet been finalized so it was not included in this project's overall budget. This will be adjusted during the midyear budget process.

DISCUSSION

On Thursday, September 14, 2023, the City published the Request for Proposals in the Paramount Journal and on the City's website.

On Tuesday October 10, 2023, the Director of Public Works opened and examined the bids for the WSAB Bikeway Phase II. The bids were opened at 11:00 AM at the City Yard.

Three (3) bids were received, and the apparent low bid submitted by Environmental Construction, Inc. amounted to \$6,416,982.00. Bids received ranged from \$6,416,982.00 to \$7,260,537.76. On October 16, 2023, Environmental Construction, Inc. submitted a letter requesting to withdraw their bid (Attachment A). Therefore, the lowest responsible and responsive bid for this project was submitted by Horizons Construction Co. International in the amount of \$6,949,881.70.

The following is a breakdown of estimated total project costs:

Project: \$ 6,949,881.70 Contingency (10%): \$ 694,988.17 Total: \$ 7,644,869.87

FISCAL IMPACT

Funding for this project was included in the Fiscal Year 2023-24 Capital Improvements Budget utilizing grant and State budget allocation funds. The total project amount of \$7,644,900 exceeds the already appropriated amount of \$4,732,000. The additional \$2,912,900 needed for this project will be funded utilizing a combination of State budget allocation funds and Measure M.

VISION, MISSION, VALUES, AND STRATEGIC OUTCOMES

The City's Vision, Mission, and Values set the standard for the organization; establish priorities, uniformity, and guidelines; and provide the framework for policy decision making. The Strategic Outcomes were implemented to provide a pathway to achieving the City's Vision. This item aligns with Strategic Outcome No. 2: Community Health and No. 5: Attractive and Well-Maintained Infrastructure.

RECOMMENDED ACTION

It is recommended that the City Council 1) appropriate an additional \$2,912,900 from the available State budget allocation and Measure M funds; and 2) award the contract for the WSAB Bikeway Phase II to Horizons Construction Co. International, Orange, California, in the amount of \$6,949,881.70, and authorize the Mayor or her designee to execute the agreement.

This contract agreement is made and entered into for the above-stated project this 24th day of October 2023, by and between the City of Paramount, as AGENCY and Horizons Construction Co. International as Contractor.

WITNESSETH that AGENCY and Contractor have mutually agreed as follows:

ARTICLE I

The Contract Documents for the aforesaid project shall consist of the Notice Inviting Sealed Bids, Instructions to Bidders, Proposal, General Specifications, Standard Specifications, Special Provisions, Plans, and all referenced specifications, details, standard drawings, and appendices; together with this contract agreement and all required bonds, insurance certificates, permits, notices, and affidavits and also including any and all addenda or supplemental agreements clarifying, amending, or extending the work contemplated as may be required to ensure its completion in an acceptable manner. All of the provisions of said Contract Documents are made a part hereof as though fully set forth herein.

ARTICLE II

For and in consideration of the payments and agreements to be made and performed by AGENCY, Contractor agrees to furnish all materials and perform all work required for the above-stated project and to fulfill all other obligations as set forth in the aforesaid contract documents.

ARTICLE III

Contractor agrees to receive and accept the prices set forth in the Proposal as full compensation for furnishing all materials, performing all work, and fulfilling all obligations hereunder. Said compensation shall cover all expenses, losses, damages, and consequences arising out of the nature of the work during its progress or prior to its acceptance including those for well and faithfully completing the work and the whole thereof in the manner and time specified in the aforesaid contract documents and also including those arising from actions of the elements, unforeseen difficulties, or

obstructions encountered in the prosecution of the work and also including those arising from actions of the elements, unforeseen difficulties, or obstructions encountered in the prosecution of the work, suspension, or discontinuance of the work and all other unknowns or risks of any description connected with the work.

ARTICLE IV

AGENCY hereby promises and agrees to employ and does hereby employ, Contractor to provide the materials, do the work and fulfill the obligations according to the terms and conditions herein contained and referred to, for the prices aforesaid and hereby contracts to pay the same at the time, in the manner and upon the conditions set forth in the contract documents.

ARTICLE V

Contractor acknowledges the provisions of the State Labor Code requiring every employer to be insured against liability for workers' compensation or to undertake self-insurance in accordance with the provisions of that code and certifies compliance with such provisions. Contractor further acknowledges the provisions of the State Labor Code requiring every employer to pay at least the minimum prevailing rate of per diem wages for each craft classification or type of workman needed to execute this contract as determined by the Director of Labor Relations of the State of California.

ARTICLE VI

Contractor agrees to indemnify and hold harmless AGENCY and all of its officers and agents from any claims, demands, or causes of action including related expenses, attorney's fees, and costs based on, arising out of, or in any way related to the work undertaken by Contractor hereunder. In the event the insurance coverage is on a claims made basis the Contractor shall indemnify and hold harmless the AGENCY and all of its officers and agents from any and all claims, demands, or causes of action that arise after the expiration of the Contractor's current policy or after the service contract has ended, for any occurrences arising out of or any way related to the work undertaken by the Contractor. The liability insurance coverage values shall be:

A combined single-limit policy with aggregate limits in the amount of \$3,000,000 will be considered equivalent to the required minimum limits. The issuer shall be an "admitted

surety insurer" duly authorized to transact business under the laws of the State of California.

Acceptable insurance coverage shall be placed with carriers admitted to write insurance in California with a rating of A:VIII by A.M. Best & Co. Any deviation from this rule shall require specific approval in writing from the AGENCY.

Insurance shall name the City of Paramount, its officers, agents, and employees as additional insured by endorsement of the Contractor's policy. A copy of the endorsement, showing policy limits, shall be provided to the AGENCY on or before signing this contract.

ARTICLE VII

Contractor affirms that the signatures, titles, and seals set forth hereinafter the execution of this contract agreement represent all individuals, firm members, partners, joint venturers, and/or corporate officers having a principal interest herein.

ARTICLE VIII

ARTICLE IX

Records and Audits. The Contractor shall maintain accounts and records, including personnel, property, and financial records, adequate to identify and account for all costs pertaining to the contract and such other records as may be deemed necessary by the AGENCY to assure proper accounting for all project funds, both federal and non-federal shares. These records will be made available for audit purposes to the AGENCY or any authorized representative and will be retained for 5 years after the expiration of this Contract unless permission to destroy them is granted by the AGENCY.

ARTICLE X

False Claims and Debarment Procedures. The AGENCY hereby gives notice to Contractor that Chapter 34 of the Paramount Municipal Code dealing with false claims of contractors provides for an administrative debarment action for submitting a false claim subjecting Contractor to a potential five (5) year debarment upon finding that Contractor knowingly submitted a false claim as further set forth in Chapter 34. Failure to abide by the provisions of Chapter 34 may lead to a disqualification of the Contractor as an irresponsible bidder and resultant prohibition of Contractor, from bidding as a Contractor, Subcontractor or Consultant for a period up to five (5) years in the City of Paramount.

Subject: CARRYOVER OF UNSPENT CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECT (CIP)

BUDGET APPROPRIATION FROM FY 2022-23 TO FY 2023-24

BACKGROUND

During the budget adoption process in June, staff estimated that certain capital improvement projects (CIP) would be completed and paid by June 30, 2023. Those CIPs that were projected to roll over to the next year were included in the FY 2023-24 Adopted Budget as carryover budgets, which totaled \$23,325,550. However, the true amount of unexpended budget is not known until a few months after the close of the fiscal year when all FY 2022-23 invoices are paid. In prior fiscal years, the true-up of CIP carryover budget was done as part of the midyear budget process. We are adjusting the carryover budget at an earlier time this year to improve the management of CIP budgets and make funding available for the continuation of projects that were completed since July 2023 or are currently in progress.

DISCUSSION

By nature, capital improvement projects typically take several years to complete, and therefore, the budget for many of these projects spans across fiscal years. Depending on the scope, nature, and type of the individual CIP project, not all appropriations are spent in one fiscal year. To avoid any lapse in CIP budget, it is a normal accounting procedure, at the close of each fiscal year, that the associated budget amounts of unfinished CIPs get carried forward and re-appropriated in the next fiscal year. The process of re-appropriating funds is an annual accounting procedure necessary for the City's financial records to be accurate. Without it, the FY2023-24 Budget will be overspent.

When a CIP budget appropriation is not utilized in the fiscal year in which it was approved, the savings are put back into the original fund balance at the close of the fiscal year, and then this funding becomes available for re-appropriation in the new fiscal year. Reappropriation of only the unspent budget portion ensures that duplication of budget does not occur.

FISCAL IMPACT

The FY 2023-24 Adopted Budget included a total CIP Carryover of \$23,325,550. The additional carryover of \$2,978,814 is needed to cover expenses incurred in FY 2023-24. The list of carryover projects is provided in Attachment A. The carryover by fund is shown in the table below:

DECORATIONS

BACKGROUND

With the 25th Anniversary of the Tree Lighting Ceremony coming in December, the City Council directed staff to explore options to enhance the Holiday décor in the Downtown area. In addition to commemorating this important milestone anniversary, decorating the boulevard for the holidays could enhance economic development and help our business community by driving attention and shoppers to the Downtown area during the busiest shopping time of the year. Staff prepared a request for proposals to solicit bids from various decoration companies that can provide rental and installation of a variety of lighting and décor options.

DISCUSSION

On Thursday, September 28, 2023, the City published the Request for Proposals in the Paramount Journal and on the City's website.

On Thursday October 12, 2023, the Director of Public Works opened and examined the bids for the Downtown Holiday Lighting and Decorations. The bids were opened at 11:00 AM at the City Yard.

Two (2) bids were received, however only one (1) bid was found to be responsive as one bid submittal was incomplete. Therefore, the apparent low bid was submitted by T&G Global LLC DBA St. Nick's in the amount of \$125,316. This cost includes overhead lighting and decorations on Paramount Boulevard from Alondra Boulevard to Civic Center Drive, a complete decoration of the Christmas tree, decoration of the arches and bridges at the pond, and lighting on the roofline of the Clearwater Building.

The following is a breakdown of estimated total project costs:

Project: \$ 125,316.00 Contingency (10%): \$ 12,531.60 Total: \$ 137,847.60

FISCAL IMPACT

Funding for this project was not included in the FY 2023-24 Budget. The total project amount of \$137,850 needed for this project will be funded utilizing General Fund that could come from the proceeds of a Community Benefits Agreement.

SERVICE AGREEMENT BY AND BETWEEN THE CITY OF PARAMOUNT AND

T&G GLOBAL LLC DBA ST. NICK'S FOR DOWNTOWN HOLIDAY LIGHTING AND DECORATIONS

THIS AGREEMENT is made and entered into this 24th day of October 2023 by and between the CITY OF PARAMOUNT, hereinafter referred to as the "CITY," and T&G GLOBAL LLC DBA ST. NICK'S, hereinafter referred to as the "CONTRACTOR."

I. RECITAL

A. <u>PURPOSE</u>. The purpose of this AGREEMENT is to allow the CITY to procure the services of a qualified contractor to provide construction services in connection with the CITY'S downtown holiday lighting and decorations project, and to have these contractor services based upon the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth.

II. TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- A. <u>MISSION</u>. The CITY hereby retains the CONTRACTOR in the capacity as contractor and the CONTRACTOR hereby accepts such responsibility as described herein.
- B. <u>TERMS</u>. This AGREEMENT shall commence as of 24th day of October 2023 and shall remain in full force and effect until such time either party gives written notice of termination in accordance with those provisions set forth in paragraph P. At the time of such extensions, this AGREEMENT shall be amended as to the changes, if any, in the terms, responsibilities and compensation as determined in writing between the CITY and CONTRACTOR.
- C. <u>SCOPE OF SERVICES</u>. Under the supervision of the Director of Public Works or her designee, the CONTRACTOR shall provide all services as detailed in the CONTRACTOR's Proposal dated Thursday, October 5, 2023, and attached herein as Exhibit "A". In the event of any conflict between the provisions of this AGREEMENT and Exhibit "A," the terms of this AGREEMENT shall prevail.

Contractor shall be responsible for hauling away all material debris and leaving the site in a broom clean condition on a DAILY basis. Contractor shall provide full pedestrian protection during remodeling in accordance to City of Paramount code requirements and shall ensure business is in operation during business hours.

D. <u>COMPENSATION</u>. During the term of this AGREEMENT, the CITY shall compensate the CONTRACTOR for the services described as detailed in Exhibit "A". Invoices for payment shall be submitted on a monthly basis and shall be approved by the Director of Public Works or her designee.

The CONTRACTOR shall submit an itemized invoice to the CITY according to work progress, setting forth the work performed, and the rates charged in accordance with the contractor's fee schedule.

All change orders, additions, deletions, or adjustments to the CONTRACTOR's specifications must be submitted in writing to the CITY for approval. The CITY is the sole authority regarding change orders and the CONTRACTOR shall not change, alter, or delete, in any manner, any portion of these specifications of the CITY.

E. <u>EXPENSES</u>. CONTRACTOR shall not be entitled to an expense account and shall not be required or permitted to incur expenses on behalf of the CITY in addition to the expenses required for completion of the scope of services described herein. The compensation described herein includes provision for all CONTRACTOR expenses required to complete the scope of services described herein.

F. INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR.

- (a) CONTRACTOR is and shall at all times remain as to the City a wholly independent CONTRACTOR. The personnel performing the services under this Agreement on behalf of CONTRACTOR shall at all times be under CONTRACTOR'S exclusive direction and control. Neither City nor any of its officers, employees, or agents shall have control over the conduct of CONTRACTOR or any of CONTRACTOR'S officers, employees, or agents, except as set forth in this Agreement. CONTRACTOR shall not at any time or in any manner represent that it or any of its officers, employees, or agents are in any manner officers, employees, or agents of the City. CONTRACTOR shall not incur or have the power to incur any debt, obligation, or liability whatever against City, or bind City in any manner.
- (b) Neither CONTRACTOR, nor any of CONTRACTOR'S officers, employees or agents, shall obtain any rights to retirement, health care or any other benefits which may otherwise accrue to City's employees. CONTRACTOR expressly waives any claim CONTRACTOR may have to any such rights.
- (c) City shall not be liable for compensation or indemnification to CONTRACTOR for injury or sickness arising out of performing services hereunder.

G. <u>INDEMNIFICATION</u>.

(a) All officers, agents, employees, sub-Contractors, their agents, officers and employees who are hired by or engaged by CONTRACTOR in the performance of this Agreement shall be deemed officers, agents and employees and sub-Contractors of CONTRACTOR, and City shall not be liable or responsible to them for anything whatsoever.

- (b) CONTRACTOR agrees to save, keep, hold harmless and defend City and all of its elected and appointed boards, commissions, officers employees and agents from all claims, damages, costs or expenses in law and in equity, including costs of suit and expenses for legal services, that may at any time arise or be claimed because of damage to property or injury to persons, including City, allegedly received or suffered by reason of any wrongful or negligent act or omission on the part of CONTRACTOR or any of its agents, officers and employees and sub-Contractors in the performance of this Agreement.
- (c) CONTRACTOR shall not be deemed to assume any liability for wrongful or negligent acts of City or its officers, agents, employees and sub-Contractors, and City shall defend and hold CONTRACTOR harmless against any such claims.
- (d) CONTRACTOR agrees to defend, indemnify, and hold harmless the City, its elected and appointed boards, commissions, officers, employees and agents from all claims, demands, liability fines and penalties made by CONTRACTOR'S employees from health, retirement or other benefits attributable to services performed pursuant to this Agreement.

H. PREVAILING WAGES.

- (a) Wage rates for this Project shall be in accordance with the "General Wage Determination Made by the Director of Industrial Relations Pursuant To California Labor Code, Part 7, Chapter 1, Article 2, Sections 1770, 1773 and 1773.1", for Los Angeles County. Wage rates shall conform with those posted at the Project site.
- (b) The following Labor Code sections are hereby referenced and made a part of this Agreement:
 - 1. Section 1775 Penalty for Failure to Comply with Prevailing Wage Rates.
 - Section 1777.4 Apprenticeship Requirements.
 - 3. Section 1777.5 Apprenticeship Requirements.
 - 4. Section 1813 Penalty for Failure to Pay Overtime.
 - 5. Sections 1810 and 1811 Working Hour Restrictions.
 - 6. Section 1775 Payroll Records.
 - 7. Section 1773.8 Travel and Subsistence Pay.
- I. <u>RECORD AUDIT</u>. In accordance with Government Code, Section 8546.7, records of both the AGENCY and the CONTRACTOR shall be subject to examination and audit by the Auditor General for a period of three (3) years after final payment.

- J. <u>SUCCESSOR AND ASSIGNMENT</u>. The services as contained herein are to be rendered by the CONTRACTOR whose name is as appears first above written and said CONTRACTOR shall not assign nor transfer any interest in this AGREEMENT without the prior written consent of the CITY. Claims for money by CONTRACTOR from the CITY under this contract may be assigned to a bank, trust company, or financial institution without such approval. Written notice of any such assignment or transfer shall be furnished promptly to the CITY.
- K. <u>INSURANCE</u>. Without limiting the CONTRACTOR'S indemnification of the CITY, the CONTRACTOR shall provide and maintain at this own expense during the term of this AGREEMENT for the following programs of insurance covering his operation hereunder. Each program of insurance, except professional liability insurance shall name the CITY as "Additionally Insured" and each policy shall contain a provision that such insurance will not be cancelled, nor any change whatsoever made in policies, except upon not less than thirty (30) days prior notice to the CITY, mailed by registered mail with postage prepaid. Such insurance shall be provided by insurer(s) satisfactory to the CITY and evidence of such programs satisfactory to the CITY shall be delivered to the CITY on or before the effective date of this AGREEMENT.

General Liability. A program including, but not limited to, comprehensive general liability including automobile coverage with a combined single limit of not less than \$1,000,000.00 per occurrence. Such insurance shall be primary to and not contributing with any other insurance maintained by the CITY. The issuer shall be an "admitted surety insurer" duly authorized to transact business under the laws of the State of California.

Acceptable insurance coverage shall be placed with carriers admitted to write insurance in California with a rating of A:VIII by A.M. Best & Co. Any deviation from this rule shall require specific approval in writing from the City.

Insurance shall name the City of Paramount, its officers, agents, and employees as additional insured by endorsement of the Contractor's policy. A copy of the endorsement, showing policy limit, shall be provided to the City on or before signing this contract.

Failure on the part of the CONTRACTOR to procure or maintain required insurance shall constitute a material breach of this AGREEMENT upon which the CITY will immediately terminate this AGREEMENT.

<u>Worker's Compensation Coverage</u>. State statutory limits, deductibles, self-insurance retention, or similar forms of coverage limitations or modifications must be declared to and approved by CITY.

<u>Automobile Liability Insurance</u>. In an amount not less than Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000) combined single limit per accident for bodily injury and property damage covering owned, non-owned and hired vehicles.

- L. <u>COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS</u>. The parties agree to be bound by applicable federal, state, and local laws, regulations and directives as they pertain to the performance of this AGREEMENT.
- M. <u>SEVERABILITY</u>. In the event that any covenant, condition or other provisions herein contained is held to be invalid, void or illegal by any court of competent jurisdiction, the same shall be deemed severable from the remainder of the AGREEMENT and shall in no way affect, impair or invalidate any other covenant, condition or other provision contained herein. If such condition, covenant, or other provision shall be deemed invalid due to its scope or breadth, such covenant, condition or other provision shall be deemed valid to the extent of the scope or breadth permitted by law.
- N. <u>INTERPRETATION</u>. No provision of this AGREEMENT is to be interpreted for or against either party because that party or that party's legal representative drafted such provision, but this AGREEMENT is to be construed as if it were drafted by both parties hereto.
- O. <u>ENTIRE AGREEMENT</u>. This AGREEMENT supersedes any and all other agreements, either oral or in writing, between the parties hereto with respect to the retention of CONTRACTOR by the CITY and contains all the covenants and agreements between the parties with respect to such retention.
- P. <u>WAIVER</u>. No breach of any provision hereof can be waived unless in writing. Waiver of any one break of any provision shall not be deemed to be a waiver of any other breach of the same or any other provision hereof.
- Q. <u>CONTRACT EVALUATION AND REVIEW</u>. The ongoing assessment and monitoring of this AGREEMENT is the responsibility of the City Manager, or his designee.
- R. <u>TERMINATION OF AGREEMENT</u>. This AGREEMENT may be terminated by either party by giving written notice at least thirty (30) days prior to the effective termination date in the written notice. In such event, all finished or unfinished documents, data, studies, surveys, drawings, maps, models, photographs and reports prepared by the CONTRACTOR under this AGREEMENT shall, at the option of the CITY, becomes its property and the CONTRACTOR shall be entitled to receive just and equitable compensation for any work satisfactorily completed hereunder. Notwithstanding the above, the CONTRACTOR shall not be relieved of liability to the CITY for damages sustained by the CITY by virtue of any breach of the AGREEMENT by the CONTRACTOR, and the CITY may withhold any payments to the CONTRACTOR for the purpose of set-off until such time as the exact amount of damages due the CITY from the CONTRACTOR is determined.
- S. <u>CHANGES</u>. The CITY or CONTRACTOR may request changes in the scope of the services of the CONTRACTOR to be performed hereunder. Such changes, including any increase or decrease in the amount of the CONTRACTOR'S compensation,

which are mutually agreed upon by and between the CITY and the CONTRACTOR, shall be incorporated in written amendments to this AGREEMENT.

- T. <u>REPORTS AND INFORMATION</u>. CONTRACTOR, at such times and in such forms as the CITY may require, shall furnish the CITY such periodic reports as it may request pertaining to work or services undertaken pursuant to this AGREEMENT, the costs and obligations incurred or to be incurred in connection therewith, and any other matters covered by this AGREEMENT.
- U. <u>RECORDS AND AUDITS</u>. CONTRACTOR shall maintain accounts and records, including personnel, property, and financial records, adequate to identify and account for all costs pertaining to this AGREEMENT, and such other records as may be deemed necessary by the CITY to assure proper accounting for all project funds, both federal and non-federal shares. These records will be made available for audit purposes to the CITY or any authorized representative and will be retained for five (5) years after the expiration of this AGREEMENT unless permission to destroy them is granted by the CITY.
- V. <u>FINDINGS CONFIDENTIAL</u>. All of the reports, information, data, etc., prepared or assembled by the CONTRACTOR under this AGREEMENT are confidential and the CONTRACTOR agrees that they shall not be made available to any individual or organization without the prior written approval of the CITY.
- W. <u>COPYRIGHT</u>. No report, maps, or other documents produced in whole or in part under this AGREEMENT shall be the subject of an application for copyright by or on behalf of the CONTRACTOR.
- X. <u>PERSONNEL</u>. CONTRACTOR represents that it has, or will secure at its own expense, all personnel required in performing the services under this AGREEMENT. Such personnel shall not be employees of or have any contractual relationship with the CITY. All of the services required hereunder will be performed by CONTRACTOR or under its supervision and all personnel engaged in the work shall be fully qualified and shall be authorized or permitted under the state and local law to perform such services. None of the work or services subcontracted hereunder shall be specific by written contract or agreement and shall be subject to each provision of this AGREEMENT.

III. EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY

During the performance of this AGREEMENT, the CONTRACTOR agrees as follows:

A. EQUAL OPPORTUNITY.

(a) The CONTRACTOR will not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, creed, sex, color, or national origin. The CONTRACTOR will take affirmative action to ensure that applicants are

employed, and that employees are treated during employment, without regard to their race, creed, sex, color, or national origin. Such action shall include, but not be limited to the following: employment, upgrading, demotion, or transfer; recruitment or recruitment advertising; layoff or termination; rates of pay or other forms of compensation; and selection for training, including apprenticeship. The CONTRACTOR agrees to post in conspicuous places, available to employees and applicants for employment, notices to be provided by the CITY setting forth the provisions of this non-discrimination clause.

- (b) The CONTRACTOR will, in all solicitation or advertisements for employees placed by or on behalf of the CONTRACTOR, state that all qualified applicants will receive consideration for employment without regard to race, creed, color, sex, or national origin.
- (c) The CONTRACTOR will cause the foregoing provisions to be inserted in all subcontracts for any work covered by this AGREEMENT so that such provisions will be binding upon each subcontractor, provided that the foregoing provisions shall not apply to contracts or subcontracts for standard commercial supplies or raw materials.
- (d) The CONTRACTOR will comply with all provisions of Executive Order 11246 of September 24, 1965, and of the rules, regulations, and relevant orders of the Secretary of Labor.
- (e) The CONTRACTOR will furnish all information and reports required by Executive Order 11246 of September 24, 1965, and by the rules, regulations, and orders of the Secretary of Labor, or pursuant thereto, and will permit access to his books, records, and accounts by the CITY and the Secretary of Labor for purposes of investigation to ascertain compliance with such rules, regulations, and orders.
- (f) In the event of the CONTRACTOR'S non-compliance with the equal opportunity clauses of this AGREEMENT or with any of such rules, regulations, or orders, this AGREEMENT may be canceled, terminated, or suspended in whole or in part and the CONTRACTOR may be declared ineligible for further government contracts in accordance with procedures authorized in Executive Order 11246 of September 24, 1965, and such sanctions may be imposed and remedies invoked as provided in Executive Order 11246 of September 24, 1965, or by rule, regulation, or order of the Secretary of Labor, or as otherwise provided by law.
- (g) The CONTRACTOR will include the provisions of paragraphs (1) through (6) in every subcontract or purchase order unless exempted by rules, regulations, or orders of the Secretary of Labor issued pursuant to Section 204 of Executive Order 11246 of September 24, 1965, so that such

provisions will be binding upon each subcontractor or vendor. The CONTRACTOR will take such action with respect to any subcontract or purchase order as the CITY may direct as a means of enforcing such provisions, including sanctions for non-compliance; provided, however, that in the event the CONTRACTOR becomes involved in, or is threatened with, litigation with a subcontractor or vendor as a result of such direction by the CITY, the CONTRACTOR may request the United States to enter into such litigation to protect the interests of the United States.

- B. <u>CIVIL RIGHTS ACT OF 1964</u>. Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, provides that no person shall, on the grounds of race, color, or national origin, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of or, be subjected to discrimination under any program or activity receiving Federal financial assistance.
- C. <u>AGE AND DISABILITY</u>. Any prohibition against discrimination on the basis of age under the Age Discrimination Act of 1975, or with respect to an otherwise qualified handicapped individual, as provided in Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 and the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990, shall apply to this AGREEMENT.

IV. CONFLICT OF INTEREST

During the performance of this AGREEMENT, the CONTRACTOR agrees as follows:

- A. <u>INTEREST OF MEMBERS OF THE CITY</u>. No member of the governing body of the CITY and no other employee, or agent of the CITY who exercises any functions of responsibilities in connection with the planning and carrying out of the program, shall have any personal financial interest, direct or indirect, in this AGREEMENT.
- B. <u>INTEREST OF CONTRACTOR</u>. CONTRACTOR represents, warrants and agrees that he does not presently have, nor will he acquire during the term of this AGREEMENT, any interest, direct or indirect, by contract, employment or otherwise, or as a partner, joint venture or shareholder (other than as a shareholder holding a one-percent (1%) or less interest in publicly-traded companies) or affiliate with any business or business entity that has entered into any contract, subcontract, or arrangement with the CITY.
- C. <u>INTEREST OF OTHER LOCAL PUBLIC OFFICIALS</u>. No member of the governing body of the locality and no other public official of such locality, who exercises any functions or responsibilities in connection with the planning and carrying out of the program, shall have any personal financial interest, direct or indirect, in this AGREEMENT; and the CONTRACTOR shall take appropriate steps to assure compliance.

This will give you an early picture of the flow of the events. Establishing the dates this early will allow staff to schedule vendors, secure services and materials in a timely manner, and plan for staffing. Listed below is a complete list of the 2024 special events provided by the City or co-sponsored by the City. Regarding Friday Night Paramount, you will notice that we will go dark starting the month of November through the month of February. This is due to inclement weather during those months which has led to low attendance in past years.

2024 Holiday Events

The City's holiday event programming, as shown in the Special Events Schedule above, begins each season with the Holiday Tree Lighting event which is held on the Wednesday following Thanksgiving. In 2024, the Holiday Tree Lighting event will occur on December 4th. The Santa Train occurs during the second week of December followed by the Santa Snowfest event on Saturday that same week.

This year, the annual Tree Lighting creates a conflict with the scheduled Planning Commission meeting on December 4, 2024. We are proposing that the Planning Commission meeting either go dark or move their meeting to another date.

The operation of the Santa Train during the week of December 9-12 creates a conflict with the scheduled City Council meeting on December 10. We are proposing that the City Council move its scheduled meeting on December 10 to the following Tuesday, December 17. In previous years, the City Council chose to cancel the second City Council meeting and we are proposing the same for 2024. This will, in turn, require that the December Public Safety Commission meeting on Tuesday, December 17, 2024, either go dark or move their meeting to another date.
