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


### YOUTH PROGRAMS








## **Background**

- Award of contract for housing rehabilitation construction services through the Home Improvement Program
- 15145 Castana Avenue
- Program provides repairs for owner-occupied single-family detached homes and mobile homes on fixed foundations
- Household must qualify as low-to-moderate income
- Federal HOME funds
- The city contributes 80% or 90% of construction cost and the property owner contributes 20% or 10%



### **AWARD OF CONTRACT**

VV&G was selected as the lowest qualified bidder

The work (\$39,035.00) to be completed at the residence includes the following:

- Install new water heater
- Apply new stucco color coat
- Install new windows
- Roof repairs



### **BACKGROUND**

- Phase II Somerset Boulevard to Rosecrans Avenue - includes:
  - Bicycle and pedestrian lighting
  - Landscaping
  - Decomposed granite
  - Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) Curb ramps
  - At-grade pedestrian/cyclist crossing
  - Street furniture for trail users





### **BID OPENING AND RESULTS**

- City published the Request for Proposals in the Paramount Journal and on the City's website on September 14, 2023
- Bids were opened on October 10, 2023
- Three (3) bids were received
  - Apparent low bid: Environmental Construction, Inc. (withdrew bid)
  - Next responsive bid: Horizons Construction Co.
    - \$6,949,881.70
- Bids ranged from \$6,416,982 to \$7,260,537.76

Project: \$6,949,881.70
Contingency: \$694,988.17
TOTAL: \$7,644,869.87

#### **FUNDING**

- Included in the FY 2023-24 Capital Improvements Budget utilizing grant and State budget allocation funds
  - Caltrans Active Transportation Program
  - State budget:
    - Speaker Emeritus Anthony Rendon (2022)
    - Senator Lena Gonzalez (2023) had not yet been finalized, so not included in this project's overall budget but will be adjusted during midyear budget.
- Total project amount of \$7,644,900 exceeds the already appropriated amount of \$4,732,000
- Additional \$2,912,900 needed will be funded utilizing a combination of State budget allocation funds and Measure M

# RECOMMENDED ACTION

#### STRATEGIC OUTCOMES

- It is recommended that the City Council:
  - 1. appropriate an additional \$2,912,900 from the available State budget allocation and Measure M funds, and;
  - 2. award the contract for the WSAB Bikeway Phase II to Horizons Construction Co. in the amount of \$6,949,881.70 and;
  - 3. authorize the Mayor or her designee to execute the agreement

# Why do CIP Budget Carryover?

- CIP Budget –Financial Plan for the Life of the Project (1 5 years)
- Budget Appropriation Lapse at the end of the fiscal year on June 30<sup>th</sup>
- Carryover of unspent Budget Appropriation is necessary and part of annual budget and accounting procedure
- FY 2023-24 CIP Budget will be overspent if reappropriation of unspent budget does not occur.


