#### Request

This item is a request for a zone change from R-M (Multiple-Family Residential) to C-3 (General Commercial) to allow for the expansion of an existing church at 6838 Somerset Boulevard. The Planning Commission recommended approval of this item at its April meeting. This item is in connection with General Plan Amendment No. 18-1, to be heard later by the City Council. The General Plan Land Use designation for Zone Change No. 229 is Multiple-Family Residential and Commercial.

#### **Background**

On April 10, 2018, the Planning Commission considered and approved Zone Change No. 229. The west half of the site is zoned C-3 (General Commercial), while the east half is zoned R-M (Multiple Family Residential). This C-3 (General Commercial) zone change proposal will allow for correction of the split zoning and allow for a uniform zone. The lot on which the church is located is appropriate and consistent with other projects approved for a church use within the City.

#### **Discussion**

In 1962, the City Council adopted the Zoning Map, which can be amended in accordance with the provisions of Article XIII of Chapter 44 of the Municipal Code and the California Government Code.

The applicant, Los Angeles International Church of Christ (LAICC), is currently leasing the building and is proposing various building and property improvements to reflect the proposed new ownership of the property. The sale of the property is contingent upon the approval of this request and all associated applications mentioned in the background for this project. Upon approval of General Plan Amendment No. 18-1, the proposed zone will be consistent with the General Plan Land Use Designation of Commercial, which allows for a church use. Given the existing C-3 properties to the north and east of the subject site, the project will not be out of character with the surrounding zoning and the General Plan. Moreover, the expansion of the church continues upon an existing use that has long held a presence within the neighborhood. Finally, the project will integrate well with the surrounding neighborhood, which is comprised of residential properties of varying densities, in addition to commercial and light industrial uses.

The following map represents the proposed area for **Zone Change No. 229 – 6838 Somerset Boulevard.** 





## **Summary**

The proposed zone change from Multiple-Family Residential to Commercial will allow for the expansion of an existing church. As discussed above, approval of this request will correct the split zoning of the property. The proposal will continue to successfully integrate the church into the surrounding neighborhood, which is developed with a mix of residential, commercial, and light manufacturing uses. The commercial area to the east and north will provide excellent off-site amenities to the congregants, and approval of the proposed project will allow for a significant aesthetic improvement to a location that has stood underutilized and in a dilapidated condition for many years.

#### **Environmental Assessment**

As part of this project, an environmental analysis was conducted by a consultant, Blodgett Baylosis Environmental Planning. The analysis determined that the project will not have an impact on the environment, and a Mitigated Negative Declaration and a Mitigation Monitoring Program is the appropriate CEQA document for the proposed project.

#### **Recommended Action**

It is recommended that the City Council read by title only, waive further reading, introduce Ordinance No. 1102, and place it on the next regular agenda for adoption.

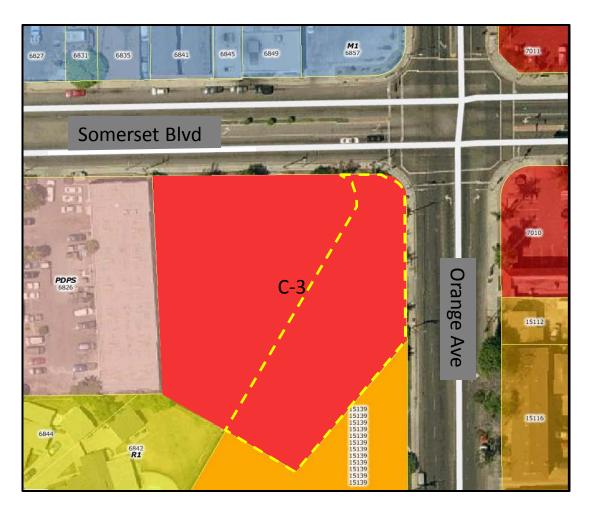

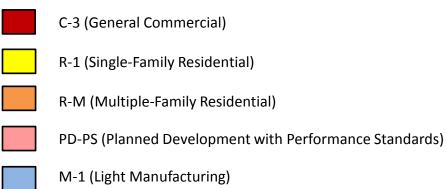

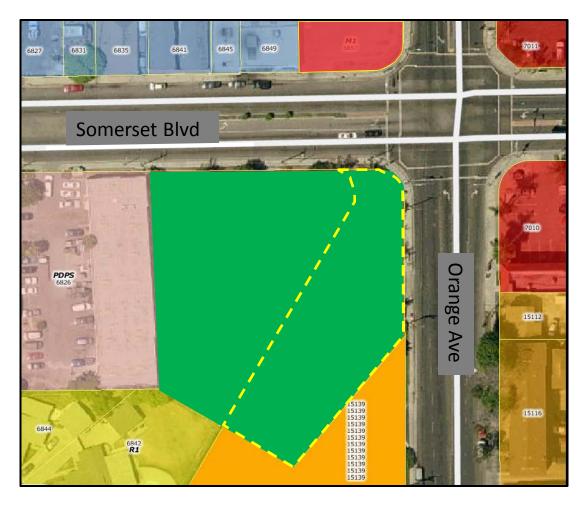

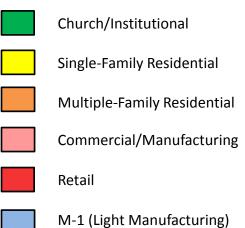

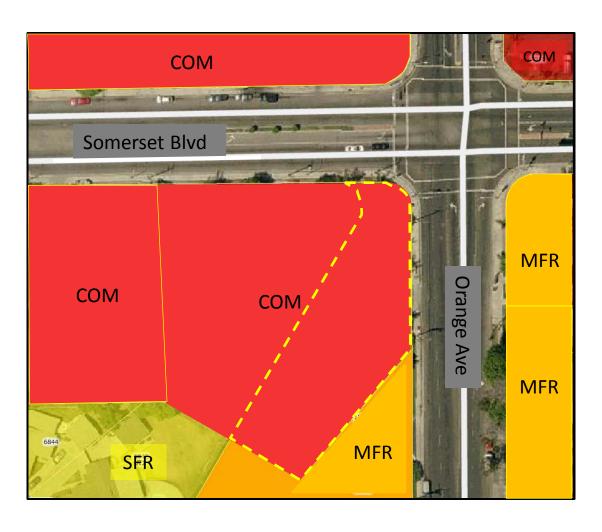

Subject: BIENNIAL REVIEW OF CONFLICT OF INTEREST CODE

The Political Reform Act requires all public agencies to adopt a Conflict of Interest Code. The Conflict of Interest Code designates positions required to file a Statement of Economic Interests (Form 700) and assigns disclosure categories specifying the types of financial interests to be reported.

In 1990, Government Code Section 87306.5 was added to the Political Reform Act and mandates that a review of the Conflict of Interest Code be performed by the code reviewing body no later than July 1 of each even-numbered year. As the code reviewing body for the City of Paramount's Conflict of Interest Code (Resolution No. 12:011), the City Council has until July 1, 2018 to provide direction to perform a review of the Code.

Following City Council's direction, the City Clerk will submit the City's Conflict of Interest Code to the City Attorney to review and determine if changes are necessary. The City Attorney will advise the City Clerk if changes to the Code are necessary. If he determines that changes need to be made, as required by Government Code Section 87306.5, an amended Conflict of interest Code will be submitted to the City Council. If no changes are necessary, a written statement stating that no changes to the Conflict of Interest Code are required will be submitted to the City Council no later than October 1, 2018.

### Recommended Action

It is recommended that the City Council direct the City Clerk to commence a review of the City's Conflict of Interest Code no later than July 1, 2018, and report the results to the City Council no later than October 1, 2018.

WHEREAS, it has become necessary for the City Council, as the Code Reviewing Body, for both the Successor Agency and the Oversight Board to the former Community Redevelopment Agency of the City of Paramount to amend and add these new local entities to the City's Conflict of Interest Code.

NOW THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PARAMOUNT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Resolution No. 10:026 is hereby repealed.

<u>Section 2</u>. The Conflict of Interest Code of the City of Paramount is hereby adopted as follows:

The Political Referm Act, Government Code Section 81000, et seq., requires state and local government agencies to adopt and promulgate Conflict of Interest Codes. The Fair Political Practices Commission has adopted a regulation, 2 Cal. Code of Regulations Section 18730, which contains the terms of a standard Conflict of Interest Code, which can be incorporated by reference and which may be amended by the Fair Political Practices Commission to conform to amendments in the Political Reform Act after public notice and hearings. Therefore, the terms of 2 Cal. Code of Regulations Section 18730 and any amendments to it duly adopted by the Fair Political Practices Commission are hereby incorporated by reference. These provisions, along with the attached Appendix A in which officials and employees are designated, and Appendix B in which disclosure categories are set forth, constitute the Conflict of Interest Code of the City of Paramount, which is considered the "agency" within the purview of this code. The Conflict of Interest Code of the City of Paramount so adopted amends and replaces any Conflict of Interest Code of the City of Paramount previously in effect.

Section 3. The City Clerk shall be and perform the duties of Filing Officer for the City of Paramount. Persons holding designated positions shall file-Statements of Economic Interests-with the City Clerk, the originals of which shall be on file with the City-Clerk's Office.

Section 4. Any change provided for in this-Conflict of Interest Code shall not affect or excuse any offense or act committed or done or omission or any penalty or forfeiture-incurred or accruing under any other Conflict of Interest Code; nor shall it affect any prosecution, suit, or proceeding pending or any judgement rendered in connection with any other Conflict of Interest Code.

<u>Section-5</u>. The City Clerk shall certify to the passage and adoption of this Resolution and enter it into the book of original Resolutions.

### **Background**

This application is a request for a City Council Permit to allow live entertainment at DeLucia, a bar located at 14123 Garfield Avenue in the M-2 (Heavy Manufacturing) zone. DeLucia opened for business on February 4, 2018 in the 4,430 square foot former location of the Torino Lounge. On January 26, 2018, the California Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control (ABC) issued a Type 42 license to DeLucia, allowing only for the sale of beer and wine for on-site consumption with no building access to minors. Business hours are Sundays to Wednesdays from 11:00 a.m. to 1:00 a.m. and Thursdays to Saturdays from 11:00 a.m. to 2:00 a.m. The two City Council Permit applicants of record are Jose Hernandez, the president/chief financial officer (CFO) of the business corporation (De Herdez), and Joseph Hernandez, the operations manager. The CFO has also been part of the property ownership since acquiring the property in 2005.

The 20,000 square foot site is surrounded on all sides by industrial uses, including an office furniture wholesaler/installer at the property to the south; Ace Clearwater Enterprises, a metal manufacturer of complex formed and welded assemblies for the aerospace and power generation industries, to the west/rear; D&T Recycling to the north; and Paramount Auto Dismantlers across Garfield Avenue to the east. Eight parking stalls, including two stalls compliant with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA), are at the front of the property, and 19 parking stalls are to the rear of the building for a total of 27 parking stalls.

Section 11-5 (n) of the Paramount Municipal Code states that a City Council Permit is required for live entertainment. Following the permit review process, the City Council may grant or deny a request for a City Council Permit based on the impact that the proposed use will have on the public health, safety, or welfare. The City Council may also impose conditions upon a City Council Permit to ensure that the use is not in conflict with surrounding land uses.

### Request

The applicant is requesting a City Council Permit to allow live entertainment on the following days, hours, and formats from an existing platform inside the lounge:

Fridays	8 p.m. to 12 a.m.	Musicians (trios, flamenco, rumba flamenca, bossa nova, pop music, Afro Cuban, charanga music, Latin jazz) and DJ (Top 40)
Saturdays	8 p.m. to 1 a.m.	Musicians (Spanish rock, '80s tribute bands, Top 40) and DJ (Top 40)
Sundays	12 p.m. to 4 p.m.	Mariachi

### **Torino Lounge History**

As noted above, the previous business at 14123 Garfield Avenue was Torino Lounge, which originally operated under the ownership of Francisca Ramirez-Peña following submittal of a business license application on May 2, 2011. On October 11, 2011, the City Council approved a City Council Permit for live entertainment for a variety of musical formats and days/hours as jointly submitted by Francisca Ramirez-Peña and Joseph Hernandez.

On December 3, 2014, Community Development Department and Public Safety Department staff, Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department personnel, and Deputy District Attorney Kelly Tatman met with the Torino Lounge business operators and Joseph Hernandez following a variety of incidents, including a gunshot incident on November 2, 2014 at a neighboring property where Torino Lounge security guards were uncooperative with Sheriff's deputies.

On September 1, 2015, Community Development Department and Public Safety Department staff, Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department personnel, and Deputy District Attorney Kelly Tatman met with the Torino Lounge business operators following a number of incidents involving law enforcement, parking complaints from neighboring businesses and property owners, difficulties with an outside promoter, unpermitted entertainment formats, and concerns from ABC agents.

On November 3, 2015, the City Council conducted a public hearing to review the City Council Permit, and set February 2, 2016 for a three-month review. However, a shooting incident at Torino Lounge in December 2015 prompted a hearing to be held on January 5, 2016.

On January 5, 2016, the City Council conducted a public hearing, approved suspension of the City Council Permit for live entertainment, and set a public hearing date for January 19, 2016 to consider revocation of the City Council Permit for live entertainment.

On January 19, 2016, the City Council conducted a public hearing with testimony from Sheriff's deputies and the lieutenant and adopted Resolution No. 16:001, approving the revocation of the City Council Permit for live entertainment.

On January 27, 2016, Francisca Ramirez-Peña notified the City of Paramount of her decision to close Torino Lounge and terminate her lease at 14123 Garfield Avenue.

On May 2 2016, Jose Hernandez and Rick Morales submitted a business license application for DeMorez Vine Corporation to operate Torino Lounge under their joint ownership.

On July 18, 2016, Jose Hernandez and Rick Morales as owners of the Torino Lounge submitted a City Council Permit application for live entertainment. In the ensuing months, the two DeMorez Vine/Torino Lounge owners could not reach agreement on a number of issues and eventually dissolved their partnership.

### **DeLucia Bar - New Applications**

On March 1, 2018, the DeLucia applicants submitted an initial application for live entertainment with musicians proposed on Wednesdays to Sundays. Staff informed the applicants of the unlikelihood of approval given the recent history of live entertainment at the property and insufficient time since the opening date of February 4, 2018 to demonstrate the high level of business responsibility required of operating with live entertainment.

On May 8, 2018, the applicants withdrew the application from March 1, 2018 and submitted a revised application with a reduction in the entertainment schedule, the addition of DJs, and changing occasional mariachi performances on Sundays to mariachi music every Sunday. Staff continued to advise the applicants of the premature timing of the application submittal, but the DeLucia owners were undeterred in their choice to pursue immediate City Council Permit review.

### **Discussion**

As required by the Municipal Code, the Community Development Department, Public Safety Department, the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department, the Los Angeles County Fire Department, and the Los Angeles County Department of Public Health have reviewed the application, including the site plan. The Sheriff's Department opposes the request (letter attached) based on the history at this business in relation to live entertainment. The Public Safety Department requested that the Los Angeles County District Attorney's Office review this request. Los Angeles County Deputy District Attorney Kelly Tatman also does not recommend approval of the live entertainment request (email attached). The Fire and Health Departments do not recommend approval or denial.

In light of the total history of live entertainment at Torino Lounge, recommendations for denial from the Sheriff's Department and the Deputy District Attorney, the associated offenses, violations, complaints, law enforcement incidents directly and indirectly related to the live entertainment, and the current applicants' connection to the original City Council Permit application, the Community Development Department recommends denial for this City Council Permit for live entertainment application.

### **Recommended Action**

It is recommended that the City Council read by title only and adopt Resolution No. 18:016, denying a City Council Permit for live entertainment at DeLucia at 14123 Garfield Avenue.

In light of the total history of live entertainment at Torino Lounge, recommendations for denial from the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department and the Los Angeles County Deputy District Attorney, the associated offenses, violations, complaints, and law enforcement incidents directly and indirectly related to the live entertainment, and the present Applicant's connection to the City Council Permit for live entertainment revoked by the City Council on January 19, 2016, the City Council is unable to determine that the Applicant and its employees are of good and moral character and reputation and that the proposed amusement or live entertainment operation under the permit will comport with the peace, health, safety, convenience, morals and general welfare of the public.

### Adriana:

After our meeting on March 21, 2018 with Joseph Hernandez and his father regarding his March 2, 2018 Live Entertainment Application for DeLUCIA, located at 14123 Garfield Avenue, I recommend City Council deny his May 2018 Live Entertainment Application. This property and business has been a source of Public Safety concern for some time.

### **Brief history**

On April 29, 2011, Joseph Hernandez and Francisca Pena apply for a permit for a business at 14123 Garfield to be named Tornio Lounge.

On October 12, 2011, a Live Entertainment Permit is granted for very specific formats with very specific conditions.

Between October 2011 and late 2014, calls for service and activity at the location was limited to petty theft and car thefts.

On December 3, 2014, Public Safety Staff, Sheriff's Department Personnel and I met with the business owners to discuss the increase in calls for service and to review the Live Entertainment Permit conditions. Also, it was pointed out that the Live Entertainment Permit issued to the business required licensed security guards (2) present for live entertainment on Friday and Saturday nights. The business owners acknowledged they used non-licensed guards and would rectify the issue.

In April 20, 2015, Public Safety Staff, Sheriff's Department Personnel and I met again with Joseph Hernandez, Ricardo Hernandez, Sergio Pena and Francisca Pena, business owners of Torino Lounge. At that time, we were concerned with the most recent calls for service for burglaries to vehicles, petty theft reports, fights outside the location as well as a reported robbery of a bar patron leaving the location near closing time.

During this meeting, the business owners indicated they added a different format, Hip Hop Night. This was in direct violation of their Live Entertainment Permit. Not only was the format unilaterally implemented without authorization, but the live entertainment continued past the curfew of 11:00 p.m., also in direct violation of their Live Entertainment Permit. When asked how the lounge started doing Hip Hop night and utilizing a promoter for this format, the managers stated they were simply approached by the promoter and decided to give this theme a try. When asked what sort of research or investigation they did into the promoter prior to hiring him for Hip Hop Nights, the managers/owner stated they

did very little, if any. At the conclusion of the meeting, the business owners promised to make the necessary changes to abide by their Live Entertainment Permit.

Between April 2015 and August 2015, the business continued to host Hip Hop Night and introduced another unapproved format of Mariachi Nights on July 16, 2015 outside in the parking lot of the business. The business failed to obtain a Special Events Permit. It should be noted that the business knew to obtain such a permit, because they had submitted an application two weeks prior to host a large fourth of July event outside in the same area, but the application was denied.

During this time, there also had been an increase in complaints to Public Safety from neighboring businesses regarding parking issues from bar patrons that were negatively affecting their retail stores. Sheriff's Department resources were directed to self-initiated patrols to this area to create a presence in the area to ward off car burglaries and other illegal criminal activity.

In September 2015, another meeting was held where Public Safety Staff, Sheriff's Personnel and myself met with the business owners again regarding their continued violations of the Live Entertainment Permit and increase in complaints. It is important to note that although invited, Joseph Hernandez failed to appear at this meeting.

On December 5, 2015, there was a shooting incident at Torino Lounge. During the investigation, security personnel was extremely uncooperative with law enforcement and tampered with crime evidence. It should be noted that the guards were not licensed as required by the Live Entertainment Permit. Also, employees and management were uncooperative with law enforcement during the investigation. The business owners informed Law Enforcement that although video surveillance footage was working at the time of the shooting, the single camera that would have captured the entire incident was not. In the days following the incident, the Station Lieutenant opined that bar staff and security staff hampered the investigation of this matter.

In February 2016, following a public hearing on Torino Lounge's Live Entertainment Permit, City Council suspended the permit and Torino Lounge subsequently closed.

### **Present**

On March 21, 2018, Public Safety Director Adriana Lopez and I met with Joseph Hernandez and his father Jose Hernandez regarding a new Live Entertainment Permit they submitted for the renamed business of DeLUCIA located at 14123 Garfield. Not only was Joseph and his father almost an hour late to the meeting, they blamed their tardiness on the pitfalls of having a toddler at home.

During this informal meeting, we pointed out to the gentlemen our reluctance in recommending approval of their new application. We discussed the history of Torino Lounge and the fact that Joseph was a partner in the business that failed to e adhere to prior conditions, even after several meetings with Public Safety, the SAGE Deputy District Attorney and Sheriff's Personnel. In fact, we pointed out that not only did the business continue to violate the permit conditions after these meetings, but failed to cooperate with law enforcement in a highly important shooting investigation.

Joseph attempted to distance himself from that business and acted as if he really wasn't a part of Torino Lounge. However, this contradicts his attendance at Public Safety Meetings with the business, his name on the prior applications and the fact he spoke out against suspending the Torino Lounge Live Entertainment Permit at the Public Hearing before City Council in February 2016.

We offered Joseph advice in obtaining the trust of Public Safety and Law Enforcement for permit approval by suggesting he host small permitted special events that would run smoothly without issue. We provided him a roadmap of suggestions for him to show he is capable of abiding by permit conditions and hence could adhere and respect a Live Entertainment Permit down the road.

Following our meeting, Joseph withdrew his Live Entertainment Permit and submitted a new one.

The withdrawn March 2018 application requested live entertainment on Wednesday (Salsa Classes), Thursdays (80's bands, Trios), Fridays (Trios, Flamenco, Rumba Flamenca, Bossa Nova and Pop Music, Afro Cuban and Charanga Music, Latin jazz until 1:30 a.m.), Saturdays (Blues and Bluegrass/Spanish Rock, Tribute 80's Bands and Top 40) and Sundays (Occasional Trios or Mariachi).

The new May 2018 application requests live entertainment on Friday (Top 40 DJ from 8 p.m. to 12 a.m.), Saturdays (Live Music/Spanish Rock, Tribute Bands 80's and Top 40 from 8 p.m. to 1 a.m.) and Sundays (Brunch mariachi from 12 p.m. to 4 p.m. with the average group between 4-7 persons).

The difference between the two is a decrease in two days of live music, but the addition of a DJ and not occasional Mariachi on Sundays, but Mariachi Bands every Sunday. Music format for Live Bands remains unchanged.

### Recommendation

Not only does Joseph Hernandez have a history of violating his Live Entertainment Permit as part owner of Torino Lounge, but he has a history of failing to take responsibility for the violations of that permit and instead distances himself and blames his co-owners. After previous violations were pointed out to the business owners, Joseph failed to attend meetings to address Public Safety Staff, Law Enforcement and SAGE Deputy concerns.

Following our most recent recommendations, Joseph Hernandez demonstrates an inability to accept the advice of Public Safety to gain and restore trust in his ability to manage his business in a successful, safe and peaceful environment.

At this time, I do not recommend City Council approve the most recent application for a Live Entertainment Permit at DeLUCIA, 14123 Garfield Avenue, in the City of Paramount.

The purpose of this letter is to provide you with our concerns regarding the proposed Live Entertainment Permit for "DeLucia Bar."

We have conducted a review of calls for service for 14123 Garfield Avenue, the "DeLucia Bar," formerly known as the "Torino Lounge." In 2015, the Torino Lounge previously had live entertainment which resulted in significant law enforcement responses. This included: one shooting, three armed robberies, five vehicle burglaries, two stolen vehicles, and thirteen disturbance calls related to fights or violence. Conversely, since the live entertainment ceased, there has been a reduction in these types of incidents over the past two years.

Live entertainment attracts people from various cities, specifically various neighborhoods where rivalries exist. This may result in violent incidents and crimes near and around the establishment.

Based on the past history at this business in relation to live entertainment, it is the opinion of the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department to oppose the request for a Live Entertainment Permit.

Subject: Revised Scope of Work to the Farmers Market Agreement with So Cal Farmers

Market

In March 2016, the City Council approved an agreement with So Cal Farmers Market that provided for the operation of a farmers market at Progress Park. The agreement provides for a yearly extension of the agreement following the conclusion and review of each preceding annual operating period. A one year extension was provided in March 2017 following the conclusion of their first year of operation.

Due to some issues that occurred during the second year of operation, we have made some adjustments to the Exhibit A "Scope of Work" section of the agreement that we would like to implement before providing the yearly extension. There are no proposed changes to the actual agreement itself, other than changes to the Scope of Work. These changes to the Scope of Work more clearly identify the responsibilities of So Cal Farmers Market in the operation of our market and address the issues we had during the second year of market operation. These specific changes are in bold on the attached Scope of Work and are summarized below:

- 4. The north parking lot at Progress Park will be available for participants of the weekly Farmers Market but shall not be used by vendors associated with So Cal Farmers' Market.

- 6. 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THIS AGREEMENT FOR FARMERS MARKET SERVICES IN THE CITY OF PARAMOUNT (the "Agreement") is made this 25th day of March, 2016, by and between the CITY OF PARAMOUNT, hereinafter referred to as "City" and So Cal Farmers' Markets, hereinafter referred to as "Market Provider."

### WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, Market Provider has the management, experience, expertise, and other assets necessary to assist the City in providing a weekly Farmers Market; and

WHEREAS, City has a need for a Farmers Market;

**NOW THEREFORE**, in consideration of the foregoing recitals and covenants set forth herein, the parties hereto do agree as follows:

### 1. SERVICES

- 1.1 <u>Purpose</u>: Market Provider agrees to provide a weekly Farmers Market program upon the terms, conditions and location(s) hereinafter set forth.
- 1.2 <u>Scope of Work</u>: Market Provider will provide the services to be rendered and the location(s) identified as set forth in Exhibit A (Scope of Work), attached hereto and wholly incorporated by reference.

### 2. TERMS AND TERMINATION

2.1 <u>Contract Term:</u> This Agreement shall commence as of the 25<sup>th</sup> day of March, 2016, and shall continue for a period of 1 year or until such time that either party gives written notice of termination in accordance with those provisions set forth in Section 2.2. 4.2 **Force Majeure:** Neither party shall be held responsible for losses, delays, failure to perform, or excess costs caused by events beyond the control of such party. Such events may include, but are not restricted to, the following: Acts of God, fire, epidemics, earthquake, flood or other natural disaster, acts of the government, riots, strikes, war or civil disorder.

4.3 <u>Succession</u>: This Agreement shall be binding on the heirs, executors, administrators, and assigns of the parties hereto.

### 5. GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

### 5.1 **Nondiscrimination**:

(a) Market Provider shall comply with all applicable federal, state, and local laws, rules, and regulations with regard to discrimination in employment because of age, race, religion, color, sex, physical or mental disability, marital status or national origin. A party entitled to attorney's fees shall be entitled to all other reasonable costs for investigating such action, taking depositions and discovery and all other necessary costs incurred in such litigation. All such fees shall be deemed to have accrued on commencement of such action and shall be enforceable whether or not such action is prosecuted to judgement.
- 5.6 <u>Hold Harmless</u>: Market Provider agrees to defend, hold harmless and indemnify City, its officers, agents, and employees, for liability arising out of the activities of the Market Provider, its independent farmers, its associates, and its employees from and against all claims, actions or causes of action of every name, kind and description which may be asserted, prosecuted or established against them arising out of or in any manner connected with the conduct of aforesaid services of Market Provider under this Agreement, except as arises from the negligence of the City.

This item is a request to extend the parking lot sublease agreement between the City of Paramount and the United States Postal Service (United States Post Office at 7200 Somerset Boulevard) for parking that is located on the Southern California Edison (SCE) easement at 7150 Somerset Boulevard. The Post Office is a sub-lessee from the City of Paramount who leases the portion of the easement used for parking directly from SCE. The easement area measures 86 feet by 330 feet, and accommodates 25 parking places.

This sublease was first entered into in 2009 for five years, with one five-year extension that will expire at the end of this year. The term of the new sublease will be from January 1, 2019 through December 31, 2023, with an option for a five-year extension. The rent the City collects from the Post Office for the parking lot for the first year is \$11,042, and increases three percent each year. This dollar amount is consistent with the amount that the City pays to SCE for our lease.

The sublease was entered into due to the high demand for parking at the Post Office. There continues to be a high demand for parking at the Post Office and it is recommended that the sublease agreement be extended. Attached is a copy of the sublease agreement.

### **Recommended Action**

It is recommended that the City Council authorize the Mayor to enter into a sublease agreement with the United States Postal Service for parking at 7150 Somerset Boulevard.

### **AGREEMENT**

THIS AGREEMENT made and entered into this 1<sup>st</sup> day of January, 2019 by and between the CITY OF PARAMOUNT, a Municipal Corporation, hereinafter referred to as the ("Lessee"), and the UNITED STATES POSTAL SERVICE, hereinafter referred to as the ("Sublessee").

### RECITALS

- A. Lessee is a party to that certain Lease ("Lease") dated November 20, 2008, with Southern California Edison ("Lessor") which includes the Premises commonly known as 7150 Somerset Boulevard, City of Paramount, California, 90723 consisting of approximately 20,614 square feet.
- B. Pursuant to the Lease, Lessee has a limited right to sublet all or a portion of the Premises.
- Lessee desires to sublet to Sublessee the Premises for the use by Sublessee as a public parking lot.
  - 1. DESCRIPTION OF PREMISES. The Lessee, for and in consideration of the performance of the covenants and agreements hereinafter contained to be kept and performed by the Sublessee, upon the following terms and conditions, hereby leases to the Sublessee, and the Sublessee hereby hires and takes of and from the Lessee, those certain premises located at 7150 Somerset Boulevard, within the Boundaries of the City of Paramount, in the County of Los Angeles, State of California, and legally described in Exhibit "A" attached hereto and made a part hereof.
  - 2. TERM. The term of this Sublease shall be for a period of five (5) years commencing January 1, 2019 and ending December 31, 2023.
  - 3. RENT. The Sublessee hereby agrees to pay as rent for said demised Premises herein during the term, the sum of Eleven Thousand and Forty-Two Dollars (\$11,042) for the first year; Eleven Thousand and Three Hundred and Seventy-Three Dollars (\$11,373) for the second year; Eleven Thousand and Seven Hundred and Fourteen Dollars (\$11,714) for the third year; Twelve Thousand and Sixty-Five Dollars (\$12,065) for the fourth year; and Twelve Thousand and Four Hundred and Twenty-Seven Dollars (\$12,427) for the fifth year. Rent is payable in equal installments at the end of each calendar month. Rent for a part of a month shall be prorated. Rent checks shall be payable to:

THE CITY OF PARAMOUNT 16400 Colorado Avenue Paramount, CA 90723 Attn: Kevin Chun, Assistant City Manager unless the Sublessee is notified, in writing by Lessee, of any changes in payee or address at least sixty (60) days before the effective date of the change.

- 4. USE. Lessee agrees that the demised Premises together with all appurtenances thereto belonging or in any wise appertaining shall be used by the Sublessee as a public parking lot. Lessee agrees that Sublessee shall have the appropriate control and authority to manage, regulate, administer and oversee the public parking lot on the demised Premises and the public's use thereof. Sublessee, at its own cost and expense, shall maintain the demised Premises, including all improvements constructed thereon, in a good condition of repair in compliance with all requirements of law.
- 5. CANCELLATION. Sublessee shall have the right to cancel this Sublease at any time by giving the Lessee not less than one hundred eighty (180) days prior written notice.
- 6. DAMAGE OR DESTRUCTION. Sublessee agrees that should the demised Premises be damaged by fire, flood, incidents of war, earthquake, or other elements as to render them, or a portion thereof, reasonably unfit for Sublessee's use, as determined at Sublessee's sole discretion, then Lessee and Sublessee agree to negotiate in good faith the terms and conditions for terminating or continuing this Sublease.
- 7. LESSEE'S ACCESS. Sublessee agrees to permit the Lessee or Lessee's authorized agents free access to the demised Premises at all reasonable times, and upon advance notice to Sublessee, for the purpose of inspection or for making necessary improvements or repairs.

### 8. DEFAULT.

- a. Default by Sublessee. Sublessee agrees that if default shall be made in the payment of rent in the manner herein provided or in any of the covenants or agreements herein contained on the part of the Sublessee to be kept and performed which constitute a material breach of the Sublease, it shall be lawful for the Lessee to declare said term ended and to terminate this Sublease upon the giving of thirty (30) days written notice. In addition hereto, Lessee shall have such other rights or remedies as may be provided by law. Lessee may not terminate the Sublease if (1) Sublessee cures the default within the thirty (30) day period after the notice is given, or (2) the default cannot reasonably be cured within the thirty (30) days after notice is given, but Sublessee reasonably commences to cure the default within the thirty (30) day period and diligently and in good faith continues to cure the default.
- b. Default by Lessee. Lessee shall not be in default in the performance of any obligation required to be performed under this Sublease unless Lessee has failed to perform such obligation within thirty (30) days after

the receipt of written notice of default from Sublessee specifying in detail Lessee's failure to perform or within such shorter period of time as may be specified herein. Sublessee may terminate this Sublease upon Lessee's default of any material obligation upon giving thirty (30) days written notice of termination. In addition thereto, Sublessee shall have such other rights or remedies as may be provided by law. Sublessee may not terminate the Sublease if (1) Lessee performs and meets the obligation within the thirty (30) day period (or shorter specified period) after notice of default is given, or (2) the obligation cannot reasonably be performed within thirty (30) days after notice of default is given, but Lessee reasonably commences to cure the default within the thirty (30) day period (or shorter period as may be specified herein) and diligently and in good faith continues to cure the default. Rent shall abate for any period of time the demised Premises, or any portion thereof, are determined by the Postal Service to have been rendered untenantable, or unfit for use and occupancy, by reason of such condition.

- c. Receipt of Notice. Notwithstanding anything in Paragraph 11 herein to the contrary, receipt of notice under this Paragraph shall be conclusively presumed to have occurred on the earliest of.
  - (1) The date of personal deliver to a party's agent or employee at the party's place of business, as stated in Paragraph 11, below.
  - (2) The date of delivery shown upon the United States postal Service's return receipt for certified or registered mail.
  - (3) Ten (10) days after deposit of notice to the address stipulated in Paragraph 11, sent by first class mail with the United States Postal Service, provided prior or concurrent notice has been attempted pursuant to Paragraph 11, but delivery has been refused or the notice otherwise returned without delivery.
- 9. ASSIGNMENT; SUBLETTING. Sublessee shall have the right to assign this Sublease or sub-Lease the Premises so long as the intended use is consistent and compatible with the use described in this Sublease and upon the condition that the assignee or sub-Lessee expressly assumes and agrees in writing to pay the rent and to perform each and every covenant and agreement in this Sublease required by Sublessee to be paid or to be performed. Sublessee shall not be relieved from any obligation under this Sublease by reason of any subletting or assignment. Sublessee agrees to notify Lessee of any change in tenancy.
- 10. ALTERATIONS. Lessee and Sublessee agree not to make any structural alterations in or on the demised Premises without first securing the prior written consent of the other party and further agree to make such alterations only at such time that it is agreeable to said other party. Consent shall be given or denied within thirty (30) days of receipt of written request. Consent

shall not be unreasonably withheld. Should there be no response within thirty (30) days, the request is deemed approved. "Structural" alterations shall be any modification to the improvements on the demised premises with results in a change in the structural integrity of the improvements or alters the gross cubic area of the improvements. Notwithstanding any other provisions, the Sublessee may make non-structural alterations without Lessee's prior written consent.

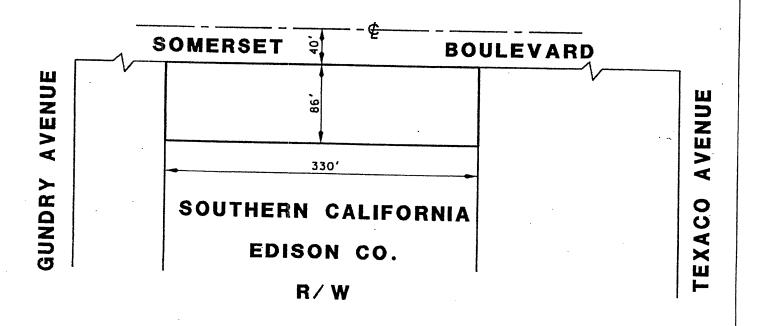

#### **General Conditions to USPS Ground Lease**

#### 1. CHOICE OF LAW

This Lease shall be governed by federal law.

#### 2. RECORDING

Not Required

#### 3. ASSIGNMENTS

- a. The terms and provisions of this Lease and the conditions herein are binding on the Landlord and the Postal Service, and all heirs, executors, administrators, successors, and assigns.
- b. If this contract provides for payments aggregating \$10,000 or more, claims for monies due or to become due from the Postal Service under it may be assigned to a bank, trust company, or other financing institution, including any federal lending agency, and may thereafter be further assigned and reassigned to any such institution. Any assignment or reassignment must cover all amounts payable and must not be made to more than one party, except that assignment or reassignment may be made to one party as agent or trustee for two or more parties participating in financing this contract. No assignment or reassignment will be recognized as valid and binding upon the Postal Service unless a written notice of the assignment, is filled with:
  - (1) The contracting officer; and
  - (2) The surety or sureties upon any bond.
- c. Assignment of this contract or any interest in this contract other than in accordance with the provisions of this clause will be grounds for termination of the contract for default at the option of the Postal Service.
- d. Nothing contained herein shall be construed so as to prohibit transfer of ownership of the demised premises, provided that:
  - (1) Such transfer is subject to this Lease agreement;
  - (2) Both the original Landlord and the successor Landlord execute the standard *Certificate of Transfer of Title to Leased Property and Lease Assignment and Assumption* form to be provided by the USPS Contracting Officer.

#### 4. CLAIMS AND DISPUTES

a. This contract is subject to the Contract Disputes Act of 1978 (41 U.S.C. 601-613) ("the Act")

- b. Except as provided in the Act, all disputes arising under or relating to this contract must be resolved under this clause.
- c. "Claim," as used in this clause, means a written demand or written assertion by one of the contracting parties seeking, as a matter of right, the payment of money in a sum certain, the adjustment or interpretation of contract terms, or other relief arising under or related to this contract. However, a written demand or written assertion by the Landlord seeking the payment of money exceeding \$100,000 is not a claim under the Act until certified as required by subparagraph d below. A voucher, invoice, or other routine request for payment that is not in dispute when submitted is not a claim under the Act. The submission may be converted to a claim under the Act by complying with the submission and certification requirements of this clause, if it is disputed either as to liability or amount or is not acted upon in a reasonable time.
- d. A claim by the Landlord must be made in writing and submitted to the contracting officer for a written decision. A claim by the Postal Service against the Landlord is subject to a written decision by the contracting officer. For Landlord claims exceeding \$100,000, the Landlord must submit with the claim the following certification: "I certify that the claim is made in good faith, that the supporting data are accurate and complete to the best of my knowledge and belief, that the amount requested accurately reflects the contract adjustment for which the Landlord believes the Postal Service is liable, and that I am duly authorized to certify the claim on behalf of the Landlord." The certification may be executed by any person duly authorized to bind the Landlord with respect to the claim.
- e. For Landlord claims of \$100,000 or less, the contracting officer must, if requested in writing by the Landlord, render a decision within 60 days of the request. For Landlord-certified claims over \$100,000, the contracting officer must, within 60 days, decide the claim or notify the Landlord of the date by which the decision will be made.
- f. The contracting officer's decision is final unless the Landlord appeals or files a suit as provided in the Act.
- g. When a claim is submitted by or against a Landlord, the parties by mutual consent may agree to use an alternative dispute resolution (ADR) process to assist in resolving the claim. A certification as described in subparagraph d of this clause must be provided for any claim, regardless of dollar amount, before ADR is used.
- h. The Postal Service will pay interest on the amount found due and unpaid from:

- (1) the date the contracting officer receives the claim (properly certified if required); or
- (2) the date payment otherwise would be due, if that date is later, until the date of payment
- i. Simple interest on claims will be paid at a rate determined in accordance with the Act.
- j. The Landlord must proceed diligently with performance of this contract, pending final resolution of any request for relief, claim, appeal, or action arising under the contract, and comply with any decision of the contract officer.

#### 5. FACILITIES NONDISCRIMINATION

- a. #### **Background**

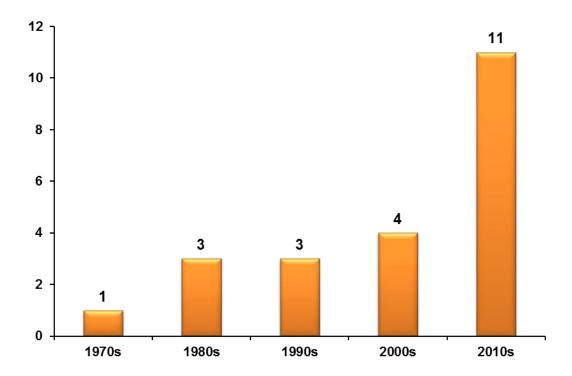
In 1971, the City Council adopted Ordinance No. 305, to amend Section 29-6 of the Paramount Municipal Code regarding traffic control devices. The amendment established the authorization to install traffic control signs such as stops signs, yield right-of-way signs, and street sweeping signs as traffic control devices. In 1983, the City Council adopted Ordinance No. 556, to amend Section 29-6.4 of the Paramount Municipal Code, regulating public parking on certain streets. Ordinance No. 556 in conjunction with Ordinance No. 305, created the first Resident Permit parking in the City. Ordinance No. 556 required that vehicles parked on the following streets from November 15<sup>th</sup> to January 1<sup>st</sup> between 7:00 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. display an authorized parking permit:

- 1<sup>st</sup> Street, 2<sup>nd</sup> Street, and 3<sup>rd</sup> Street
- Orizaba Avenue between Somerset Boulevard and 3<sup>rd</sup> Street
- Indiana Avenue between Somerset Boulevard and 3<sup>rd</sup> Street
- Jetmore Avenue between 3<sup>rd</sup> Street and Wiemer Avenue
- Wiemer Avenue between 3<sup>rd</sup> Street and Jetmore Avenue

Ordinance No. 556 was adopted in response to complaints from local residents concerning patrons from nearby business centers parking on residential streets, limiting the availability of public parking in residential communities.

Since the adoption of Ordinance No. 556, the City Council has amended Section 29-6.4 twenty-nine times. The regulation of public parking in certain neighborhoods has been established to address congestion and limited parking in neighborhoods. In the past seven years, the Public Safety Department has received eleven requests for Resident Permit parking in various neighborhoods. Out of eleven requests received, nine have occurred in the past two years, and three more have been received this year. The number of requests in the past decade has been the highest since the adoption of the Ordinance No. 556, and it is expected to increase by next year. Below is a historical bar

chart on the number of neighborhoods that have been approved for Resident Permit parking:



#### **Current Resident Permit Parking**

The original intent of establishing Resident Permit parking was to address parking in residential neighborhoods that were affected by patrons from nearby business centers and/or establishments (i.e. Paramount Adult School). In the last decade, the majority of neighborhoods that have been approved for Resident Permit parking were not located near either; instead, the requests were made by Paramount residents who wanted to restrict other Paramount residents from parking in the immediate area, sometimes only affecting a small number of homes. The approval of the last Resident Permit request (Ordinance No. 1094), which only affected seven homes, has led to animosity and disputes between neighbors. As of May 2018, the Public Safety Department has received four additional requests for Resident Permit parking for specific number blocks.

#### Public Safety Commission Meeting

On May 22, 2018, the Public Safety Commission reviewed the staff report for a temporary stay on the approval of future Resident Permit parking applications during the regular Public Safety Commission meeting. After reviewing the staff report and hearing the public comments, the Public Safety Commission made a motion to recommend that the City Council establish a temporary stay on the approval of future Resident Permit parking applications to allow Public Safety staff to create formal criteria.

#### Conclusion

Availability of public parking is a challenge in the City of Paramount, as well as in most Southern California cities. As population and housing grows, many cities are facing parking shortages in residential communities. Requests for Resident Permit parking in the City of Paramount are being submitted at a rapid pace due to the limited street parking.

Currently, the City of Paramount does not have formal criteria for approving Resident Permit parking in a neighborhood. Establishing formal criteria would allow City staff to evaluate each Resident Permit parking request in a more effective matter. Once developed, the criteria would be presented to the Public Safety Commission for a recommendation to the City Council for approval.

#### **Recommendation Action**

It is recommended that the City Council direct the City Attorney to prepare a moratorium ordinance suspending any approvals of future Resident Permit parking requests at the next meeting of the City Council and direct staff to develop formal criteria for Resident Permit parking requests.

On May 1, 2018, the City Council adopted Resolution No. 18:011 approving the Engineer's Report and Resolution No. 18:013 declaring the Council's intention to form, levy and collect assessments for Landscape Maintenance Assessment District No. 81-1. The City Council also set June 5, 2018, at 6:00 p.m. as the public hearing date for comments by affected property owners.

Pursuant to the Landscaping and Lighting Act of 1972, the City Clerk has given notice of the public hearing by causing a Resolution of Intent to be published and posted at least 10 days prior to the hearing date.

Two procedural steps are necessary at this meeting. The first is to hold the public hearing to receive protests or objections in reference to the assessment and diagram and any other matters contained in the Resolution of Intent. Following the public hearing, the City Council will consider adopting Resolution No. 18:015 confirming the diagram and assessment and providing for the annual assessment levy on Landscape Maintenance District No. 81-1. The Resolution will be adopted if written protests filed and not withdrawn, do not represent property owners owning more than fifty percent (50%) of the area of assessable lands within the District, and all protests are overruled and denied.

#### **Recommended Action**

It is recommended that the City Council read by title only and adopt Resolution No. 18:015, confirming a diagram and assessment and providing for annual assessment levy.

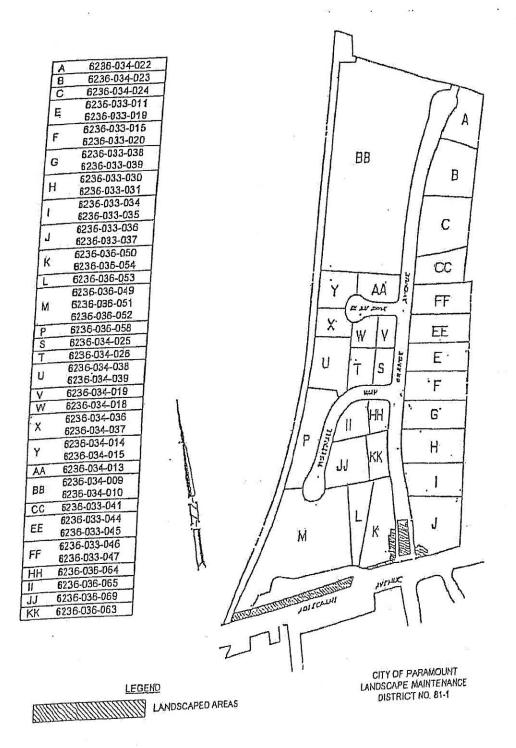

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#### I. INTRODUCTION

This report is prepared pursuant to action taken by the City Council of the City of Paramount at their regular meeting ordering a report for the levy of assessments for the fiscal year commencing July 1, 2018 and ending June 30, 2019. The report is prepared in recognition with the requirements of the California Constitution Article XIIID, and the provisions of the Landscaping and Lighting Act of 1972, being Part 2 of Division 15 of the California Streets and Highways Code. The District is known as:

#### City of Paramount Landscape Maintenance District No. 81-1

This Assessment District, by special benefit assessments, will provide funding for the operation and maintenance of public landscaping facilities within the public rights-of-way in the City of Paramount. The items funded by the District are exempt from the procedural and approval requirements set forth in Section 5a & 5b of Article XIIID of the California Constitution that states: "the following assessments existing on the effective date of this Article shall be exempt from the procedures and approval process set forth in Section 4:

- (a) any assessment imposed exclusively to finance the capital costs or maintenance and operation expenses for sidewalks, streets, sewers, water, flood control, drainage systems or vector control...
- (b) any assessment imposed pursuant to a petition signed by the persons owning all of the parcels subject to the assessment at the time the assessment is initially imposed...

The assessments for the District were petitioned by 100 percent of the owners at the time of formation, and are used exclusively to fund the maintenance and operation expenses for Landscape Improvements that are considered part of the Street Maintenance. Furthermore, the assessments for the District have not been increased since prior to July 1, 1997. Therefore, the Assessment District is exempt from the procedural and approval requirements of Article XIIID.



#### II. BOUNDARIES

Boundaries of the District consist of all properties fronting Orange Avenue or fronting streets that connect to Orange Avenue between Rosecrans Avenue on the south and the Los Angeles Department of Water and Power land rights-of-way on the north. The westerly boundary is the Los Angeles County Flood Control District right-of-way for the Los Angeles River. All parcels of land identified in the latest Los Angeles County Assessor's parcel maps within the above boundaries so designated are included in the Assessment District except those assessments not levied within that area upon public streets, other public properties, properties encumbered by easements so as to preclude development and properties of such small size or irregular shape that buildings or development could not occur upon them in a manner in which the majority of the area has been redeveloped.

#### III. IMPROVEMENTS AUTHORIZED BY THE 1972 ACT

As applicable or may be applicable to this proposed District, the 1972 Act defines improvements to mean one or any combination of the following:

- The installation or planting of landscaping.
- The installation or construction of statuary, fountains, and other ornamental structures and facilities.
- The installation or construction of public lighting facilities.
- The installation or construction of any facilities which are appurtenant to any
  of the foregoing or which are necessary or convenient for the maintenance
  or servicing thereof, including, but not limited to, grading, clearing, removal
  of debris, the installation or construction of curbs, gutters, walls, sidewalks,
  or paving, or water, irrigation, drainage, or electrical facilities.
- The maintenance or servicing, or both, of any of the foregoing.
- The acquisition of any existing improvement otherwise authorized pursuant to this section.

Incidental expenses associated with the improvements including, but not limited to:

- The cost of preparation of the report, including plans, specifications, estimates, diagram, and assessment;
- The costs of printing, advertising, and the publishing, posting and mailing of notices;
- Compensation payable to the County for collection of assessments;
- Compensation of any engineer or attorney employed to render services;
- Any other expenses incidental to the construction, installation, or maintenance and servicing of the improvements;



- Any expenses incidental to the issuance of bonds or notes pursuant to Section 22662.5.
- Costs associated with any elections held for the approval of a new or increased assessment.

The 1972 Act defines "Maintain" or "maintenance" to mean furnishing of services and materials for the ordinary and usual maintenance, operation, and servicing of any improvement, including:

- Repair, removal, or replacement of all or any part of any improvement.
- Providing for the life, growth, health, and beauty of landscaping, including cultivation, irrigation, trimming, spraying, fertilizing, or treating for disease or injury.
- The removal of trimmings, rubbish, debris, and other solid waste.
- The cleaning, sandblasting, and painting of walls and other improvements to remove or cover graffiti.

#### IV. IMPROVEMENTS

The improvements consist of maintaining the landscaping within the public rights-of-way at the entranceway to the Orange Avenue Redevelopment Project. Maintenance shall include but not be limited to watering, fertilizing, mowing, weed control, shrubbery and tree pruning, removal and replacement of dead growth, maintenance of irrigation facilities, and other necessary work. Labor, equipment and materials shall be furnished by the City of Paramount.

#### V. COST ESTIMATE

The costs shown below are estimated for fiscal year 2018/2019, and consist of the total cost for maintaining the improvements, including any surplus or deficit in funds from the previous year for these proceedings. The maintenance costs are determined by evaluating the prior year maintenance costs. The costs for fiscal year 2018/2019 are shown below.

#### VI. METHOD OF ASSESSMENT

The District was developed for the special and direct benefit of all the properties included within the District's boundaries, and all parcels benefit from the improvements. Public properties and utility properties have not been assessed. When the District was formed, each of the benefiting properties within the District was assigned a proportional benefit factor.

The following is a list of parcels and their proportional allocation originally established.

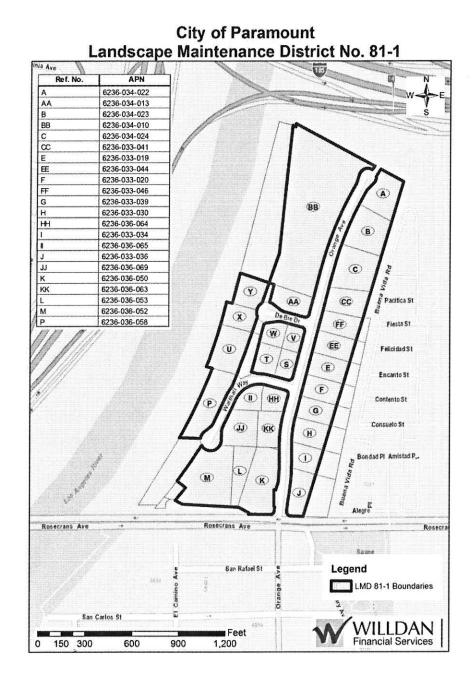
