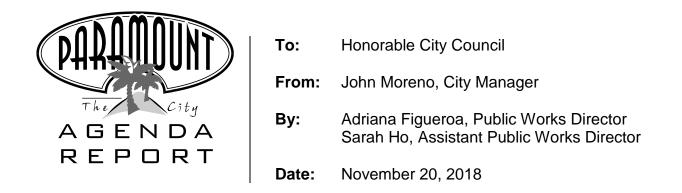

Subject: DECLARATION OF SURPLUS PROPERTY

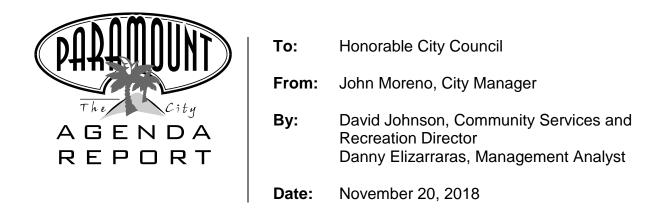

Subject: AWARD OF CONTRACT FOR THE PROVISION OF ONE (1) TOYOTA HIGHLANDER HYBRID LIMITED VEHICLE

On November 1, 2018, Community Services and Recreation staff opened and examined the bids for the provision of one (1) Toyota Highlander Hybrid Limited vehicle. The bids were opened at 11:00 a.m. in the City Hall Council Chambers.

Four (4) bids were received and the apparent low bid submitted by Toyota of Huntington Beach amounted to \$48,152.33. This bid is \$152.33 above the \$48,000 budgeted for this vehicle in the FY 2019 budget. We will be utilizing AB 2766 subvention funding to purchase this vehicle.

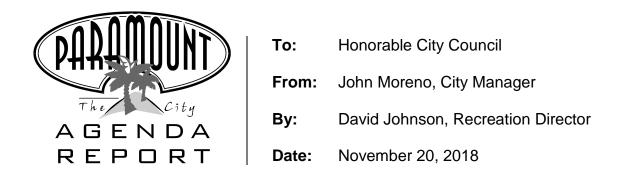

Subject: PROPOSITION 68 PROPOSED PROJECTS

The voters of California passed the Parks, Environment, and Water Bond (Proposition 68) on June 5, 2018. Proposition 68 authorized \$4 billion in general obligation bonds for state and local parks, environmental protection and restoration projects, water infrastructure projects, and flood protection.

Proposition 68 will provide approximately \$650 million in competitive grants statewide for park related projects over two funding cycles. The first cycle of competitive park grant applications, competing for approximately \$250 million, will be due sometime in the summer of 2019. The timeline for the second cycle has not been announced. The maximum grant amount is \$8.5 million and the minimum grant amount is \$200,000.

The Proposition 68 grants and projects will be managed by the California Department of Parks and Recreation. The type of projects they are looking for and that will be successful in the application process will be the development of new park space, expansion of existing park space, and renovation of existing park space that creates new recreational opportunities. All projects must have a recreational feature for public use, such as an athletic field. All projects awarded a grant must be completed by 2022.

We currently have in the FY 2019 budget the concept development of several park renovation projects and we currently have working construction drawings for one. At this point in our grant application development for the first cycle for Proposition 68, we have the following projects that we anticipate applying for Proposition 68 grant funds:

- 1. Village Park Handball Courts (full construction drawings in place)
- 2. Spane Park Soccer Field (concept being developed)
- 3. Progress Park Multi-Purpose Fields (concept being developed)
- 4. Paramount Park Community Center Expansion (concept being developed)
- 5. Salud II Park Development (concept being developed)

All these projects fall within the type of projects that the granting agency is looking for and we hope that we are able to compete as successfully in this park grant program as we did with the Proposition 84 grant program that brought us Salud Park.
