Mayor Hansen commented on the appointment being an important decision. He stated that he considered possible individuals for the vacant position and said that there was one individual that stood out to him. He then commented on Brenda Olmos' services and leadership and made a motion to appoint her to fill the unexpired term of Councilmember Diane J. Martinez. The motion was seconded by Vice Mayor Hofmeyer and the motion was passed by the following roll call vote:
