BACKGROUND

- La Diosa De Los Moles is located at 8335 Rosecrans Avenue
- The restaurant is owned by Mr. Juan Gutierrez who is also the applicant for the Live Entertainment Permit
- Licensed by Alcoholic Beverage Control (also known as ABC) for a type-41 sales license of beer and wine for onsite consumption

BACKGROUND

- Live Entertainment Permit approved by City Council on November 6, 2018
- Live Entertainment began on November 8, 2018
- On February 19, 2019 a three-month compliance review was presented to the City Council
- This is a six-month compliance review

LIVE ENTERTAINMENT FORMAT

- Trio Musicians a musical composition of three performers that sing and play an acoustic instrument
- Thursday to Sunday, between the hours of 5:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m.

LAW ENFORCEMENT ACTIVITY

- From February 19, 2019 to September 5, 2019, there were no reported incidents related to live entertainment.
- Two calls for service documented from the Sheriff's Department
- Public Safety has not received any concerns or complaints regarding noise from the performances

ANALYSIS

- No complaints or issues have been received related to live entertainment
- No law enforcement concerns have been reported
- Appropriate video surveillance system in place
- Active and valid ABC license with no disciplinary actions found

RECOMMENDED ACTION

To receive and file the report with the stipulation that staff conduct an annual review of La Diosa de Los Moles restaurant Live Entertainment Permit.

- Casa Adelita is a restaurant located in a general commercial zone (C3)
- Owned and operated by business owner Jesus Perez
- Licensed by ABC for a type-47 sales license of beer, wine, and liquor

Background

- Live Entertainment Permit approved by City Council on July 2010
- Live Entertainment Permit amendment approved by City Council on February 2017

Live Entertainment Format & Schedule

- Live Entertainment Format
 - Hosted Karaoke and 5-piece Mariachi Band
- Live Entertainment Schedule
 - Thursdays: 6:00 p.m. to 11:00 p.m.
 - Fridays: 6:00 p.m. to 11:00 p.m.
 - Saturdays & Sundays: 12:00 p.m. to 12:00 a.m.
 - Holidays: 12:00 p.m. to 12:00 a.m.

Law Enforcement Activity

- From September 5, 2018 through September 4, 2019 :
 - Two calls were audible alarm calls, and
 - Four patrol checks for live entertainment activities

Law Enforcement Activity

- A total of six calls for service have occurred regarding business disturbances, medical assistance, vehicle vandalism and petty theft.
- Based on the disposition provided for all six calls for service; the business owner was in compliance with their live entertainment permit conditions.

Analysis

- Staff analysis
 - The business owner has complied with their live entertainment conditions in the past year
 - Active and valid ABC license with no disciplinary actions found
 - Appropriate video surveillance system in place
 - Staff has not received any complaints or issues from the adjacent residents or businesses

Regional Housing Needs Assessment (RHNA)

City Council September 17, 2019

Background

- Update 6th Cycle RHNA
- CA Dept of Housing & Community Development (HCD)
 determines a housing total for regions in CA to plan for during
 8-year cycles
 - Current cycle (5th) 2013 to 2021
 - 6th cycle coming soon 2021 to 2029
- Southern CA Assoc. of Governments (SCAG) takes the HCD number, sets a methodology, distributes a housing number to each city & county

HCD Determination

- Late August HCD transmitted regional RHNA number of
 1,344,740 housing units
 for the SCAG region (Counties of Los Angeles, Orange, Riverside, San Bernardino, Ventura, Imperial)
- Extraordinarily high number
 - Supported by Governor Newsom and a majority of the State legislature
- SCAG expected to file objection, but even nominal change unlikely

SCAG Methodology

- SCAG RHNA Subcommittee has worked on methodology for allocating housing targets since late 2018
- 3 main options
- SCAG solicited comment
 - Deadline 9-13-19
- Staff submitted comments
- Gateway Cities COG submitted comments
- SCAG Regional Council will review methodology on 11-7-19

SCAG Methodology

3 options

- Share of population
- Share of population within high quality transit areas
- Share of regional undersupply of building permits issued
- Local input/Future vacancy need/Replacement need
- Social equity adjustment

SCAG Methodology Estimate Tool

- Based on proposed SCAG methodology & HCD number of 1,344,740 housing units
- Paramount:

Option 1	2,653 units
Option 2	3,236 units
Option 3	621 units

Option 3 is least likely to be adopted

Housing Element

- SCAG will approve final RHNA number in October 2020
 - City Council must adopt updated Housing Element by October
 2021 demonstrating where RHNA allocation will be located

□ Emergency repair of two deteriorated picnic shelters - located at Paramount Park.

Both picnic shelters have been fenced off and

demolished.





Background

- Included in FY 20 Budget CIP No. 9050
 - \$192,842 Capital Reserve Funds
 - Cost of the repair is \$12,842 above budget of \$180,000.
 - Difference in cost will be adjusted during the mid-year budget cycle.

Large Picnic Shelter

- Residents with reservations in large picnic shelter were accommodated in other shelters.
- □ Larger temporary canopies are being used to accommodate residents.

Small Picnic Shelter

- Small shelter has already been rebuilt.
- Contractor is currently painting the wood structure.
- Picnic shelter will be accessible to residents by the end of this week.

Recommended Action

Approve a finding that emergency conditions necessitated these repairs and authorized the payment for these emergency repairs at Paramount Park to Wehner Framing, Inc., in the amount of \$192,842.
