





Approval of Use


- In April of 2017, Governor Brown signed SB1, which provided additional state funding for road maintenance.
- Under SB1, prior to receiving funds, the City is required to identify SB1 eligible capital projects by Resolution adopted by the City Council.
- In Fiscal Year 2022-2023, the City is projected to receive \$1,258,265 in RMRA funds.
- Projects to be included in the adopted FY 23 budget:





- Bids opened on April 5, 2022
- 4 bids received:
 - Hardy and Harper Inc.- \$1,040,000
- Bids ranged from \$1,040,000 to \$1,135,334
- Funding: Prop C and Measure M

Background

- MUSCO Lighting currently provides the ballfield lighting equipment at all our ballfields
- ARPA funding approved for lighting retrofit at March 15, 2022 City Council meeting
- City Purchasing Policy allows procurement through cooperative purchasing program
 - Sourcewell, serves government, education and non-profit organizations
- Paramount Park \$242,937.50
- Progress Park \$297,663
- TOTAL COST \$540,600.50










Proposed Lighting








Background


- New bleachers are part of Paramount Park Gym Renovations (CIP No. 9265)
- Wood bleachers to be replaced with durable high impact polyethene plastic
- City Purchasing Policy allows procurement through cooperative purchasing program
 - Omnia Partners, serves government, education and non-profit
- Irwin Seating Company \$70,086.79 (includes 10-year manufacturer's limited warranty)
- Funding from Proposition 68 Per Capita Funds







Background

- On October 6, 2020, the City Council voted to adopt Resolution No. 20:029.
- Resolution No. 20:029 allows for staff initiated requests for Neighborhood Permit Parking.





Background Cont.

- On September 1, 2020, the City Council approved a zone change.
- Gold Key Development requested to change the zone from M-1 (Light Manufacturing) to PD-PS (Planned Development with Performance Standards)/Single-Family Residential.
- On July 14, 2020, the Development Review Board approved the design for the construction of ten single-family homes.











Discussion

- The Planning Director requests Neighborhood Permit Parking for the 6400 through 6500 block of Alondra Boulevard.
- Resolution No. 20:029 provides authority for the Public Safety Director to recommend to the City Council approval of Neighborhood Permit Parking for new housing development at the request of the Planning Director.
- The request for Neighborhood Permit Parking is based on a long-standing concern from residents in the neighborhood.






Spane Park Infiltration Project Grant Application Submittal – Rivers and Mountains Conservancy



Spane Project – Design

- Feasibility study shows potential for a 3.5 acre feet stormwater storage vault
- Infiltration vaults installed below grade
- Park surface and amenities reinstalled over the system
- Stormwater can be intercepted from the storm drain system on Rosecrans, diverted into the vaults and treated. Then naturally infiltrates into the water table below.











Potential Conceptual Design


- Project Scope:
 - Diversion and pre treatment system
 - Underground Storage reservoir
 - Infiltration and filtration elements
 - Nature based solutions (bioswale, LID in parking lots)
 - Potential surface improvements; soccer field, vegetation, etc.





Grant Opportunity

- Rivers and Mountains Conservancy
- Aligns with Lower Los Angeles River Master Plan
- Preliminary Estimates for entire project is \$12M
- Seeking \$5M
- Grant Application Requires Resolution to Submit and Accept the Grant, if funded.
