Application Documentation Required

- Copy of City business license
- Business expenses & financial documents demonstrating loss of revenue
- Most recent tax returns or other documents noting the number of staff employed by business
- Copy of a valid photo identification (California driver license/State-issued ID/student ID/military ID/passport or passport card)
- Complete W-9 form
- Optional documentation of damage repaired, including picture of damages or quotes received from vendors



Eligible Use of Grant Funds



- Overhead costs
- Costs associated with remaining open & meeting required safety protocols
- Costs adjusting operations to respond to new methods of providing services
- Rent relief or payment of back utilities
- Costs to retain employees –payroll, sick leave, etc.
- Marketing and promotional events
- Furniture, fixtures, equipment
- Repairs and expenses related to theft/vandalism/ property damage
- Technology hardware & digital resources

- Exempt from competitive bidding as the service can be obtained from only one vendor

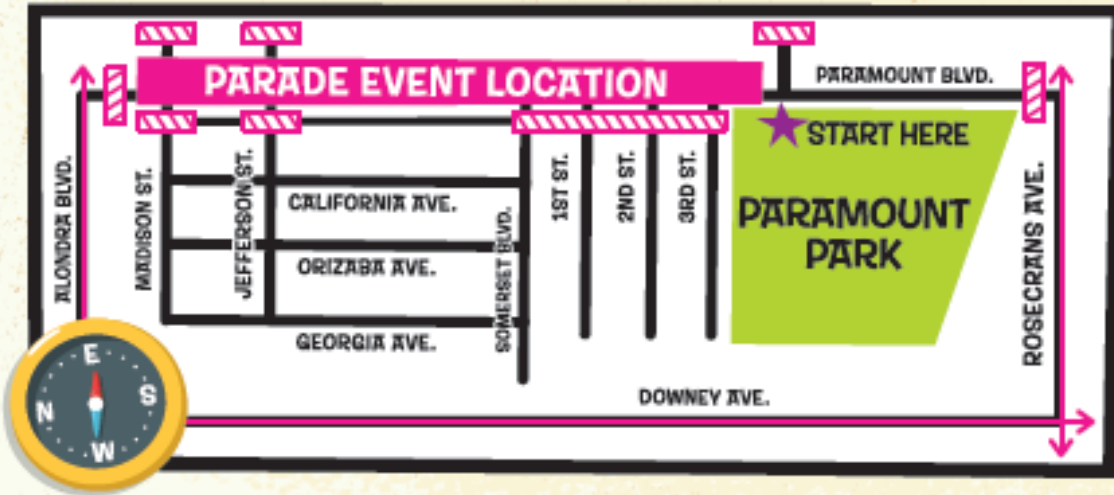

Revised Youth Sports Scholarship Program

- City Council approved the scholarship program in December, 2020
- \$30,000 budget in Community Promotion
- Open to residents participating in independent youth sports league recreation seasons
- City Council requested art programs be included at May 17, 2022 meeting

- Eligibility
 - Proof of Residency/PUSD
 - Child's Birth Certificate or Other Documentation
 - Participant – 17 years of Age or Younger
 - Proof of Income/Financial Assistance

Revised Youth Sports Scholarship Program

- Youth Sports vs. Art Programs
 - Youth Sports – one-time league fee
 - Arts Programs – on-going monthly fee
 - Eligible arts programs – any dance, music, or visual arts program offered directly by the City or through a City-sponsored instructional class program operated at a City facility

- Revised Program
 - Youth Sports and Arts Scholarship Program
 - Adaptive Recreation for Swim Lessons
 - Separate budget in Community Service Aquatics Division
 - Not financially needs based
 - Based on abilities of the child

- Adopted in March, 2016
- Street light banners on Paramount Blvd. between Somerset Blvd. and Rosecrans Ave.
- 40 total banner locations
- Currently 28 are occupied

Military Banner Recognition Program

➤ Eligibility Requirements

- Current/active member of the armed forces
- Paramount resident or resided in Paramount at time of military enrollment and have a family member currently residing in Paramount.
- No fee
- Removed at end of participant's service





Military Banner Recognition Program

➤ Proposed Eligibility Changes

- Allow graduates of Paramount Unified high schools to apply
- Paramount residents – priority
- Sunset Period
 - 4 years
 - Not applicable if not at capacity

- Current weekly farmers market at Progress Park
 - Operates under agreement with Hunger Action Network
 - Hunger Action Network employs Venaver Events LLC to manage their markets
 - Hunger Action Network no longer operates farmers markets





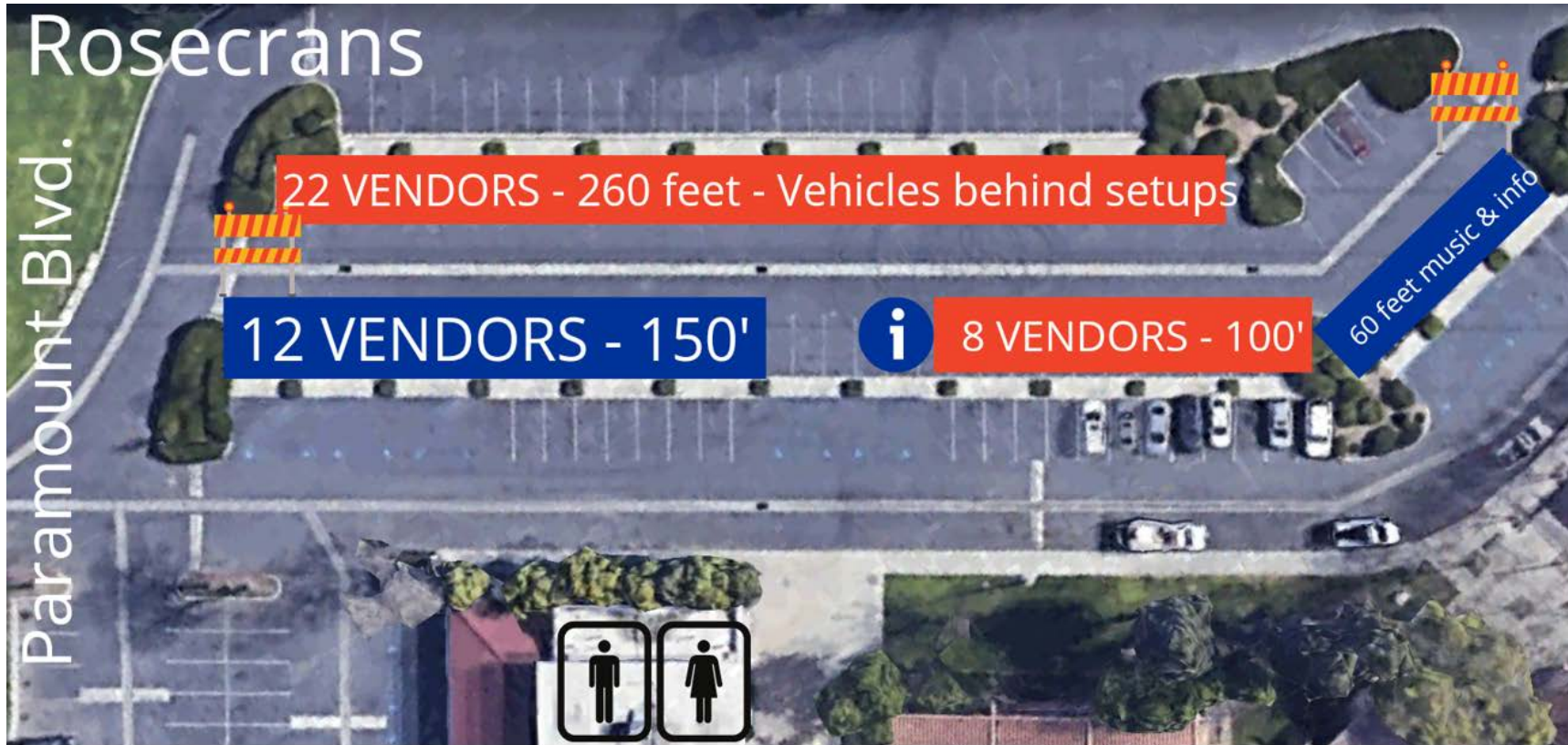
Farmers Market Agreement with Venaver

- Venaver Events LLC
 - Non-Profit
 - Operates City's Friday Night Paramount events
 - Operating 10 farmers markets
- Current agreement would be shifted to Venaver
- Proposed market changes
 - Location – move to Paramount Park
 - Day/Time – move to Saturdays, 9 a.m. to 1 p.m.

 - Combine Venaver's Paramount and Norwalk markets
 - 40+ vendors – destination market

Fireworks Code History

- In 2010, the City Council updated the fireworks code to establish a fine schedule for fireworks violations
- In 2020, the City Council voted to increase the fines for possessing, using, and selling illegal fireworks



Chapter 8.12 Fireworks

- Chapter 8.12 of the City's Fireworks code allows the sale of "Safe and Sane" fireworks
- The City's code allows the use of "Safe and Sane" fireworks only during July 3 and July 4
- "Safe and Sane" fireworks do not contain dangerous elements and are classified by the State Fire Marshal
- Chapter 8.12.030 strictly prohibits the possession, use, and sale of illegal fireworks
- Illegal fireworks contain dangerous elements that are designed to explode and/or propel into the air

Enforcement Efforts

- The Paramount Special Assignment Team and additional Fireworks Suppression Patrol Units searched for anyone using, possessing, or selling illegal fireworks in Paramount
 - » Deploy Strategic Plan
 - » Enforcement Strategies
 - » Active Patrol Checks
 - » Identify “Hot Spots”

Illegal Fireworks Penalties



- **\$5,000** fine for selling illegal fireworks
- **\$2,000** fine for using or possessing illegal fireworks
- \$250 fine for using “Safe and Sane” fireworks outside the permitted dates
- \$250 fine for “Social Host” of illegal fireworks

ITEM NO. 21

Fireworks Citation Analysis

- From July 1 to July 4, the SAO Team issued **44** fireworks citations for using, possessing, and selling illegal fireworks
 - » 15 citations for selling
 - » 24 citations for using or possessing
 - » 5 Social Host violations



ITEM NO. 21

Calls for Service Analysis

- From July 1 to July 4, Sheriff's dispatchers received **58** calls of illegal fireworks
 - » July 1: 2 calls for service
 - » July 2: 6 calls for service
 - » July 3: 9 calls for service
 - » July 4: 41 calls for service

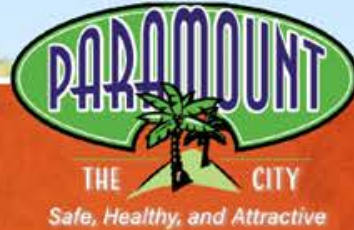

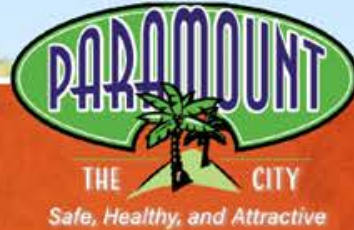
