ABOUT THE CENSUS



PURPOSE

City Net was contracted by the city of Paramount from 2022 - 2025 to organize and implement homeless censuses to:

- 1. Identify a baseline number of individuals living without housing against which to measure all homelessness prevention and intervention efforts.
- 2. Determine the demographic, asset, and other special characteristics of individuals without housing to better inform resource allocation.

OVERVIEW

These City Net censuses were distinct but complementary projects from the HUD-mandated, county-wide Point-in-Time Count. They allow for a city-specific focus with more time, staff resources, and local questions than is generally possible within the framework of the Point-in-Time Count.

City Net censuses conducted in Paramount:

2022: May 24, Morning | May 26, Evening 2023: May 23, Morning | May 25, Evening 2024: May 28, Morning | May 30, Evening 2025: June 24, Morning | June 26, Evening



METHODOLOGY

During all censuses, multiple teams were deployed with a Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department Deputy or Paramount Public Safety Department personnel. Each Paramount representative was paired with at least two City Net surveyors. Each surveyor's area was indicated on assigned maps and mapped ahead of time. Specific locations where homeless individuals were known to gather or sleep were highlighted so that these areas could be prioritized during the census. Because the goal of this project was a comprehensive census, even those areas on the teams' maps where no homeless individuals were known to gather or sleep were visited, including residential areas where homeless individuals are rarely seen.

Teams were deployed from the Paramount Sheriff's Department twice during the census week. Homeless individuals who did not wish to answer the survey questions were simply counted. Responses from participants, including timestamps and geolocations, were captured electronically through a secure GIS survey application. Duplicates were removed after the completion of the census by comparing names and age ranges. Because Comparison Reports must correlate data over multiple years, new category names may arise to allow for direct comparisons.


CONSTRAINTS

The terms "disability" and "addiction" were not defined in the survey, so the data in these categories do not necessarily represent diagnosable conditions, but only respondents' self-perceptions of the condition. Also, the only way to identify duplicates in the census was to compare the names and ages of those who chose to complete the survey. Because the census occurred over multiple days, unsheltered individuals who chose not to complete the survey may have been counted more than once, and artificial inflation of the count, therefore, cannot be ruled out. The margin of error for the Paramount 2025 Census dataset is 0.00% across all survey questions, due to full participation and response completeness among all individuals surveyed. Some percentage totals in this report may appear to be above or below 100.0% due to rounding for clarity.


ICE-related protests in Paramount required us to delay the census. These protests, and widespread concerns about increased federal enforcement by ICE may have disrupted unsheltered homeless communities. Fear of detention and increased federal presence may have led undocumented individuals—some of whom were experiencing unsheltered homelessness—to seek out areas where they could avoid public detection.

TOTAL UNSHELTERED COUNT





LIVING ARRANGEMENT PRIOR TO BECOMING HOMELESS



CURRENT SLEEPING SITUATION




DURATION OF HOMELESSNESS
















GROSS MONTHLY INCOME BEFORE TAXES

























This data was provided by the City of Bell's homeless shelter run by the Salvation Army. In partnership with the City of Paramount, a proportion of the shelter's space is utilized by the City of Paramount, and is represented here as their sheltered count. Thus, it is separate from the unsheltered count that is reported on pages 3 to 30 and 32 to 39.

The City of Paramount has up to 20 shelter beds reserved at the Bell Shelter for homeless individuals. While 18 unique individuals were counted at the shelter across both census dates, only 16 of them were present on both June 24 and June 26.





ANALYSIS & REFLECTIONS

Overall Decrease in Homelessness. Paramount's unsheltered homeless count has decreased from 43 in 2024, to 29 in 2025, a total decrease of 33%* from the previous year and sustaining a larger decrease from 2023. This suggests that Paramount's intervention efforts have yielded an overall decrease in unsheltered homelessness in a time when most communities are experiencing increases.

Migratory Population. Among those who provided sufficient name and date of birth information to enable tracking across years, less than 33% were present in any of the previous counts (2023, 2024, or both). This means that most individuals in the 2025 count were not previously surveyed, highlighting the migratory nature of the population. While intervention efforts in Paramount have been effective in connecting some homeless neighbors to shelter and housing, new individuals continue to fall into homelessness.

Changes in Receptivity to Shelter and Resources. In 2025, 67% of respondents were interested in case management while 52% were interested in going to a shelter, a 4% increase and 2% decrease from 2024 respectively. There was a slight increase in the number of respondents who reported being offered services by Paramount staff members, from 43% in 2024 to 48% in 2025, and at the same time, there was also an increase from 6% to 10% in respondents who are currently enrolled with case management. Lastly, nearly 60% of respondents who expressed interest in shelter had ownership of a pet. The data indicates that homeless neighbors are willing to accept services and stay in shelter depending on the who they can remain housed with.

Steady Decline in Chronic Homelessness. The percentage of individuals experiencing chronic homelessness in Paramount has steadily declined over the past three years; from 50% in 2023, to 45% in 2024, and down to 35% in 2025. This downward trend may indicate progress in addressing long-term homelessness through supportive services and sustained case management.

Strong Local Community Ties. Most people experiencing homelessness in Paramount have strong community connections to the city, as evidenced by the increase from 73% in 2024 to 86% of respondents who reported having ties to Paramount in 2025. In particular, 57% of respondents initially became homeless in Paramount, compared to 29% in 2024. The data suggests that most homeless neighbors we engaged fell out of housing in Paramount or a neighboring city, and maintain strong connections to the city through family relationships, employment history, education, and other current services. Given this reality, we recommend that the city continue to strengthen linkages with neighboring cities in a regional approach to ending homelessness.

Homeless Neighbors are Receptive to Survey. Although the overall survey refusal rate increased slightly in 2025 by approximately 11%, every individual who did participate answered all questions without skipping or declining any. This resulted in a 0% margin of error for survey responses, a remarkable outcome that reflects a high level of trust and willingness to engage among homeless neighbors in the City of Paramount.
